Venison Stir Fry

Cut 1 to 3 cups of venison into strips about ¹/₄" x ¹/₄" x 2-3" and lay in a marinade of Balsamic vinegar and spices (may include: garlic, and others you enjoy). Let stand while other items are prepared.

Cut up vegetables and set aside in piles Onion rings Celery slices and carrots either shredded or in thin circles Bell peppers 2" x ¹/4" slices and zucchini julienned

Brown onions and add meat; simmer a few minutes. Add celery and carrots. After a few minutes, add peppers and zucchini.

Do not let vegetables and meat get overcooked.

Adjust seasoning to taste with your favorite spices

Serve over rice, thin spaghetti or angel hair.

Preparation of meat (including marinade) and vegetables can be done in advance at home, or at the camp site.

Fruit Salad

A refreshing taste to enjoy alongside the stir fry is a fresh fruit salad.

Quarter and remove seeds from 2-3 apples. Slice. Peel and remove seeds from 1-3 oranges. Slice Halve and remove seeds from 2-3 pears. Slice. Cubes of melon can be added in season. Gently mix fruit together and top with shredded coconut. Opt: Mix in walnuts or slivered almonds before serving.

No open fires; use a fire barrel, have a fire bucket handy, bury your ashes, and leave your camp clean please.

Return to the spectacular site we enjoyed at the RMNR 2006, situated at 9,000 feet of elevation in the scenic Rocky Mountains. A private ranch, located approx. 8 miles west of Creede, Colorado on Hwy. 149, consists of rolling hills surrounded by tall, rugged mountains with open grasslands and few trees. Two creeks run through the site, emptying into a pond that is approx. 1 ½ acres in size and icy cold. There are Brook Trout in the two streams, with Browns and Rainbows in the pond. Primitive fishing will be allowed—no license required! Nights will be cold with daytime temps in the mid to high 70's, but there will always be a cool breeze in the shade.

On site wood, water and waste management, as well as emergency services, will be provided. A Wagon team for delivery of ice and camp transport (for a fee), will be available.

Early gates will open on Wednesday, July 7th. A fee of \$5.00 per person per day will apply July 7th thru July 9th. Work crew only prior to July 7th. (No exceptions)

Long-term and short-term primitive camps. Tin-tipi camp, horse camp and parking will be out of sight of the main camp.

Planned matches include rifle, pistol, trail walk, archery, and knife & hawk events. Horse games, daily kids games, and old geezer games, as well as a variety of educational and entertaining seminars, are also on the agenda.

Rules:

- Pre-1840 dress expected in camp. Prior to July 10th, set-up will be tolerated in jeans. As of July 10th thru July 18th, only appropriate primitive dress will be allowed.
- 2. Gates will be open from 8:00 am to 6:00 pm daily, July 7th thru July 10th. Please remove vehicles as soon as you unload. Primitive camp will be closed to vehicles as of 6:00 pm July 11th, except short term camp and service vehicles. Short term camp open to vehicles from July 12th through July 16th, 8:00 am to 10:00 am and 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm.
- Additional rules will be posted on site.

Ten men's teams and three women's teams signed up to see who would come away with the medallions, as well as bragging rights for another year. When the last hammer fall was taken, our #1 DCML Team took first in the men's match for the 4th year in a row. Also for the 4th year in a row Angie's Awesome Possums tallied the highest aggregate total for the ladies.

Individual high scorers were this old coot for the first time ever. Guess the \$20,000 titanium shoulder joint I got in December '08 made a difference after all. For at least the ninth year in a row now, Ginger Baumann took the honors for women's high score. This lady is hard to beat! Ned Dunn wrestled the senior high score away from Delbert Lester this year in what has become a flip flop affair. Some of us younger gummers are approaching Senior status so look for some refinements to the scoring for next year that incorporate age + score in some fashion.

Friday afternoon saw 43 shooters out banging away in light winds and cool temps. Saturday brought blustery winds along with the sunshine. Some shooters were holding as much as 32" left to account for windage at the 200 yard range. Sunday was colder than a mother-in-law's heart with below zero temps at sunrise but calm winds. Many of us that waited to finish our targets froze our fingers off but liked the still conditions.

We added a new wrinkle this year; a one target buy-back. For \$5 a shooter could round can one of his/her targets and take their chances on a better outcome. A few souls mistakenly thought they could pick and choose the better score of the two targets, but we were more heartless than that! If one bought back a target, the other one and the score with it got tossed in the stove. I heard comments both ways. Rooster and Chapin for example picked up close to 20 points with their buyback, but some like Ginger lost points, going from 6 at the 200 yard target to a big fat zero! All in all, 38% or 22 of the 58 shooters exercised their buy back option so it seemed to be a popular addition to the shoot. The proceeds of \$110 went to the WSMLA. Look for it to continue in 2011.

Dave Hein served up a gargantuan pot of ham and bean soup chocked full of goodies while DCML members served up plenty of cornbread, fruit, and desserts to go with. On Sunday Trish and Paula made sloppy joes too, so no one went away hungry. At noon Saturday a vaguely familiar face came up to me with a small lad in tow. He recognized me, but I couldn't put a name with the face. You old timers will remember George Walker, past President of DCML from 20-23 years ago; the man who came up with the idea for the winter challenge shoot in the first place. He and his wife Willa have retired and relocated to Sheridan and will be rejoining DCML. Their family is all grown and George is now teaching a grandson how to shoot. We are thrilled to have them back. And we were thrilled with the turnout for the 2010 Winter Challenge Shoot. Thanks!
