I am a native San Diegan, born in Ocean Beach, attended Crawford High School, and graduated from SDSU. Golf was a large part of my childhood. My father, who caddied as a boy in the south side of Chicago, grew to be a student of the game and wanted me to learn. At the age of 5-6 years, he would take me with him to the driving range and teach me what he knew. It wasn't long before he got me professional lessons and we joined San Diego Junior Golf Association. It was fun getting to know some girls that played as well. I played tournaments all summer and holidays in San Diego and Los Angeles. Girls couldn't play on the High School golf teams even though we could beat most of the boys (ha-ha). There were more and more opportunities available at the collegiate level and teams were being formed around the country. I played at SDSU for Coach Mary Cave.

After graduation I worked weekends at Singing Hills while teaching Math and Science at Gompers Junior High. I felt very much more at home on the golf course. I have to thank Tom Addis for mentoring me and encouraging me to take part in the LPGA teaching division. I wanted to work with women and children and see the interest grow.

I played competitively on a number of tour events and qualified for the Women's U.S. Open at La Grange Illinois in 1974. The next step was being given the chance to coach the SDSU Women's Golf Team. The young women were terrific, seeing some of the best of the best and so proud of where women's golf had come. I was at SDSU for 17 years. I'm now retired and still working at the game 60+ years later.

A question recently came up during regular sweeps play at a local club. A player hit her ball into a penalty area and could not find it. She dropped a new ball, took one stroke penalty, hit it onto the green and putted out. She then found her original ball outside the penalty area. Can she play it?

Rule 17 addresses **Penalty Areas**. Rule 17.1c specifically addresses Relief for Ball Not Found in Penalty Area. The player may take penalty relief under Rule 17.1d. Once the player puts a new ball in play the original ball is no longer in play and must NOT be played. This is true even if it is found on the course before the end of the three-minute search time.
