Just Yoking Around

Shortly after Bishop Frank Beard appointed me to Aledo UMC, I learned that its mission statement was "We exist to connect people to Jesus Christ." I was rather captivated by that statement and wondered how I might incorporate it into a sermon—ideally on my first Sunday. As it happened, one of the suggested readings for my first Sunday was Matthew 11:29 where Jesus says, "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me; for my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." I saw Christ's yoke as a metaphor for our church's mission statement. Then as Candice and I moved into the parsonage, I discovered that we owned a yoke! It's a rather simple yoke, but a yoke nonetheless, and throughout the month, that yoke has served as a visual reminder of our connection to Christ. How? Because a yoke is designed for two. When we're invited to take Christ's yoke upon us, we place ourselves under one side of the yoke. But who's on the other side of the yoke? Jesus, of course. He is on the other side of the yoke. After all, it's his yoke, and it connects us to him.

Because the yoke is such a powerful image of our church's mission statement, I received it as God's confirmation that I had been appointed to the right church. And the yoke became my theme for my sermons in July. Thus, throughout the month we've discovered that the invitation of Christ is an invitation to be literally connected to Christ by way of his yoke. Jesus goes with me as a go about my daily tasks and as I journey through this life.

We've learned that when we take on Christ's yoke, we find rest. But that doesn't mean we become couch potatoes. Rather, we are invited into a life of Sabbath-rest in which we have meaning and purpose because we are connected to Christ.

We learned that Christ's invitation is an invitation to learn from him. So what might we learn in Yoke School? We learn the gentleness and humility of Jesus. But we also learn to discern the movement of the Spirit in our lives. After all, no matter where we go, the Spirit of God is already there. We just have to attune ourselves to the Spirit. To help us discover the presence of God in our daily life, we ought to be on the lookout for simple but significant "God-incidences," such as the letter that came in the mail at just the right time. Or the stranger you met on the street who helped you when you needed it the most.

Risk Management

There has always been a certain risk in attending worship. In the early days of the church, Christians risked persecution and perhaps even martyrdom if they gathered in Christ's name. More recently, on Palm Sunday 2017, 45 Coptic Christians were killed and 126 injured in twin suicide bombings at St. George's Church in the northern Egyptian city of Tanta, and at St. Mark's Coptic Orthodox Cathedral in Alexandria.

In our own nation, four Sunday school girls were killed on September 15, 1963 when the 16th Street Baptist Church in Birmingham, Alabama was bombed; nearly two dozen more were injured. There has always been a risk in attending worship.

In previous years, worshippers risked catching a cold or even the flu at church. But this year is different, thanks to Covid-19. Limited in-person worship is now possible, and we at Aledo UMC have taken great care to minimize the risk of catching the coronavirus at our church. However, the risk has only been minimalized; it has not been eliminated. We invite you to worship with us, but only if you are comfortable and in good health.

Here are the steps we've taken to minimalize your risk:

- color-coding pews so pews are only utilized one time each Sunday
- encouraging masks (masks are available if you do not have one)
- minimizing singing
- sanitizing surfaces between Services
- hand sanitizing stations
- no passing of the collection plate

If you are in good health and not at risk for contamination, we hope you will be able to join us soon for Worship.

WIFI CHANGES AT AUMC

We have updated our wifi here at AUMC. In the past you could log on to AUMC1 in the Education Wing area, and AUMC2 in the Sanctuary area. With the updates, AUMC1 is now for staff, and not available to the public. AUMC2 is our public network, and works in the entire building. You may log into AUMC2 with the password: connectmetochrist.



In-Person Worship Attendance

To those of you who have attended in-person Worship since July 12th, thank you! Our capacity for <u>each</u> Worship Service is 75 at this time, and due to Covid19 each Service is structured the same. There is room for those of you who are comfortable with in-person Worship. Please be assured that we are doing everything we can to minimize your risk of contamination.





How is our church doing financially?

The standard answer, "There is some good news and bad news".

First, the Bad News or the Not So Good News.

Our income towards the budget for June was the worst month in 2020 and \$10,000 smaller than May. We brought in just \$16,605 which is 52% of our monthly budgeted amount. When we compare our Year to Date income to last year we are about \$10,000 short of last year. Our Year to Date donations through June 30th were short of budget by \$43,705.

How about some Good News?

Year to Date through June 30th we are underspent on expenses compared to our budget by \$44,567. This savings is similar in amount to our shortfall of donations. Some of the expense savings was related to Pastor Dan as our church did not have to pay health insurance or pension as he received those benefits as a retired Pastor. We were also underspent on many other expense categories.

All bills including conference obligations are paid through June 30th.

Our church received support from several of our partners during this unusual time. The Illinois Great Rivers Conference offered a Forgivable Loan in the amount of \$5,007 to help with cash flow. The forgiveness will be based on the percentage of conference obligations that our church pays in 2020. We also received a \$500 grant from Ameren that was available to Non-profit organizations. This came to us as a credit to our electrical bill. Our insurance carrier, Church Mutual, has offered to refund a portion of our bus insurance premium since we have not used the bus much this year.

The best news of all is that I believe every member and friend of the Aledo United Methodist Church is doing what they can to help support the ministries of our church as we strive to Connect People to Jesus Christ. I do believe that the Good News far exceeds the Not So Good News even in this unprecedented time. Thanks for all you are doing to help keep our church financially strong!

So, 100% of the money that is collected in the cans on the 9th of August will be used to help fund this valuable ministry. What a GREAT way to help connect people to Jesus Christ.
