Do You Know What An Overdose Looks Like?

August 31 is International Overdose Awareness Day. In January 2017, the Center for Disease Control estimated that the number of people in the USA who had died from overdose in the previous year was 64,070. Here are common signs of overdose for opioid drugs:

- No response to stimuli
- Shallow, labored or no breathing
- Cannot be woken up
- Snoring or gurgling
- Blue/grey lips or finger tips
- Floppy arms or legs

Overdose symptoms vary depending on substance use. Click to see common overdose signs for <u>alcohol</u>, <u>depressants</u>, <u>psychoactive substances</u> and <u>stimulants</u>. If you or a loved one have a substance use issue, call us at 813.246.4899 for help.

ACTS implemented recently on its website a new page where people can <u>request records online</u>. "On a typical day, I



get 6 or 7 medical records request a day – the website helps streamline the process and makes it easier for people to get their records."
