Pantry Christmas Blessings Continue to Pour In...

The Brewerton Elementary school students, teachers and staff completed their month-long Food Drive to benefit our local food pantry. Throughout November and up to mid-December, students are encouraged to bring a non-perishable food item to school. Our Pantry received a total of THREE truckloads of items from early November to Mid December — a record 2,585 items to be exact! The pantry shelves are filled beyond capacity; which is wonderful thing moving into the new year.

Throughout December the pantry door was a revolving one... receiving an amazing number of donations, of both monetary and nonperishable items, while serving a multitude of clients. You will see what I mean...here's the list of this month's donors: Brewerton Elementary School food drive, Cicero UMC donation of 8 boxes of holiday food items, the Saddlecreek neighborhood food drive targeting personal care & household cleaning, Zumba4Missions monthly personal care & household item donation, Jaime from Zumba "AAFit" food drive, our own Brewerton Community Child Care program "Helping Hands" donations, South Bay Sportsman Club food donations. The Central Square Lioness Club donated \$4,100 from the proceeds of the Applefest to our food pantry as well as the Central Square and North Shore pantries. Wee Care Pediatrics on Route 31 in Cicero invited me to speak at their holiday party and presented the pantry with two boxes of food, cookies, candies and a \$500 check. Our own United Methodist Women donated \$200 to our food pantry as part of their mission work. We received a \$500 donation from the Fogus family, a \$200 donation from the Thebert family of the Calvary Baptist church, and \$100 from the Lindberg family. We also received donations of holiday hams from church families and friends of the pantry.

Due to the outpouring of donations throughout the month, our pantry was able to provide 35 families in need with a complete Christmas dinner including a turkey, ham, chicken or pork tenderloin and all the trimmings. Several of the baskets included a homemade pumpkin pie prepared by Pastor Jack and his team of bakers! Three of the families (those with young children,) also received gifts thanks to our very own special "Secret Santa—a.k.a. Don Harwood" and

the help of the Divine Mercy "Caring & Sharing" program. We also received donations of adult socks, gloves, and hats that were included in the holiday baskets as were an assortment of candies and cookies. TOGETHER we were able to make the Christmas holiday a little brighter for many people, young and old.

Divine Mercy "Caring & Sharing" Program at BUMC!

With the closing of the Divine Mercy Brewerton Campus on November 1st, the parishioners no longer had a distribution site for the 85 Caring & Sharing Christmas food and gift baskets for local families in need. On December 19th & 20th, our Fellowship Room & the large Child Care Room were transformed into a Holiday Gift & Food Distribution center. Food Baskets and Large Gift bags filled with personalized gifts for each child on the list began arriving on Saturday morning into Sunday afternoon with each carefully tagged and organized for the amazing give-away that would take place from 2:00 to 5:00 that afternoon. What a great sight it was to witness! It was great to be able to open our doors for our pantry partners and friends at the former St. Agnes/Divine Mercy for their annual project to help our neighbors in need. In addition to food and gifts, each child received a pair of hand knitted mittens donated by the Friends of the NOPL in Brewerton, and displayed on their Mitten Tree.

January Food Sense

The January Food Sense Menu has been posted on the Pantry Bulletin Board in the hallway. The deadline for order/payment is Friday, January 8^{th} by NOON, please. Orders will be available for pickup at the pantry on Friday, January 22^{nd} between 1:00 and 2:00 p.m. Anyone can participate in this program which is designed to help stretch your food dollars. The monthly food package is valued at over \$30 and is available to anyone for only \$15.50. Monthly specials are also available for a reduced price. There are no eligibility requirements. The program is open to anyone. Cash or EBT (SNAP) accepted as payment. See Deb Lombard or call the pantry at 676-5528 for more information or to place an order.

Thank you for your continued support of our food pantry mission. TOGETHER we ARE DEFINITELY making a DIFFERENCE in the LIVES of MANY!!! We look forward to continuing a food pantry mission into 2016 and are committed to reaching out to those in need; to provide them with nutritious food, but more importantly showing them that as God's children, they are loved. It is through the love of this church and our community that we are able to show that love and caring to our neighbors in need.
