Aloha Kakou,

Summer time is a good time for me to reflect on how we are, what we are doing and consequently, who we are as a community of faith. Some few conversations – and interestingly only a few! – about Sunday School and Catechism (aka, Confirmation) have been the subject of my introspective noodling of late.

What to do about these traditional programs that seem to have fallen on hard times, not just at CLC but all over the country. Lutheran churches in North America used to rely on Lutheran families having Lutheran babies who would grow up to be Lutheran church members. That pattern ended about a generation and a half ago. But the thinking, discourse and expectation of Lutheran churches did not – we still seem to think, expect and talk as if the next generation will be back in "church" any day, week, or month now.

But they haven't come back, have they? This may be the biggest reason (in my humble opinion) why Lutheran churches in North America (and Hawaii!) are in numerical decline. Sunday School and Catechism as traditional routines of education and retention in the faith, as well as of church growth, are no longer working. We have schooled, catechized and confirmed hundreds if not thousands of children and young people, only to see them walk out the door and not return. These results have been over the last four decades most disappointing.

Additionally, the dynamics of family life has changed dramatically. Stay-at-homemoms, once the steady supply source for Sunday School teachers, no longer stay at home. They work; they have to. Children and youth who had plenty of free time, no longer do. Life is much busier for everyone. So, where in this busy life do adult volunteers, participating children and youth find time for all things "church"?

I wish I knew.

What I do note is that only one person volunteered last year for Sunday School teaching. We met, came up with some creative ideas, but needed a few more people to help. We couldn't find any. No one stepped forward.

So, nothing happened. And this one volunteer is no longer attending CLC.

This could be construed as "blame and shame", hoping something might happen this year. But Sunday School by guilt is counterproductive at best.

What I am interested in is honesty. Which may be more about admitting that the old ways aren't doing what they were intended to do – raise and retain our children in the faith of their forebears. And blaming each other won't help us find our way about in this complex and perplexing situation.

There are no recipes, formulas, tools or techniques, no guaranteed programs to fix this challenge, either. I think quick fixes and even thoughtfully planned strategies have fallen short.

So, what do we do? Good question. I'm stumped. If you have some thoughts or ideas, any comments or opinions, please let me know.

I don't want to abandon our children and youth. If we have something important to convey to them, something specifically about being "justified by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone," – and I think we do – then, what is to be done?

Think about it. Talk amongst yourselves. Then, get back to me.

Congratulations Graduate Class of 2017




Jiao Chen
