Dear Residents:

I have very good news about the Township's new five-year Garbage Contract with Waste Management. Beginning January 1, 2012, Waste Management will pick up recycling curbside every week on Wednesdays throughout the entire township. Your regular weekly garbage and bulk pick-up day will remain the same. Please be aware that the weekly bulk pick-up is limited to one large bulk item weekly or one 30 gallon container of bulk items. A schedule is enclosed for your convenience. The Township received a very competitive bid and does not need to increase the budget line item for garbage removal in 2012.

As you all may be aware from recent articles in the New Jersey Herald, Hampton Township can boast zero debt. The Township Committee and staff have worked tirelessly to ensure stability in the way that they provide services to the taxpayers in the most efficient and professional manner. If you ever have any concerns or questions regarding the services the Township does provide, please contact me or any member of our staff and they will be happy to assist you whenever possible. I am extremely proud of the way our employees carry out their daily responsibilities.

This past year Hurricane Irene, Tropical Storm Lee, and the October 30<sup>th</sup> snow storm presented many challenges to our residents, our Public Works Department, and Hampton Township Fire and Rescue. They worked around the clock to make certain that our roads were open and ready for JCP&L to access the lines for repair. Many of us were bitterly disappointed with the response time by JCP&L and the lack of communication with their customers. Our Legislators and Local Officials have discussed with JCP&L what they believe are improvements that they should make in order to better serve their customers. Although it was a difficult time for most of us, it was wonderful to hear about how neighbors helped each other to get through the days without power and how they helped one another to clean-up the damage that was caused as a result of the storms.

### One last important note:

The dog licensing fee has changed for 2012. The fee for all neutered dogs is \$11.00, and \$14.00 for all unneutered dogs. Dog licenses must be renewed by January 31, 2012.

I hope 2012 brings with it the hope for renewed prosperity and peace.

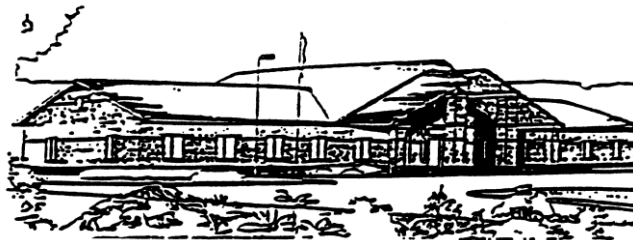

### DOG LICENSE RENEWAL

All dogs over seven months **MUST BE LICENSED**. Dog licenses may be obtained by mail by sending proof of rabies & supporting information and a check. They may also be obtained at the Hampton Township Municipal Building between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M., Monday through Friday. Please provide proof of rabies vaccination, certification of spaying/neutering (where applicable), and a fee of \$11.00 for a spayed/neutered dog and \$14.00 if the dog is not. **IMPORTANT NOTE:** A 2012 license will not be issued if the current rabies vaccination expires **BEFORE NOVEMBER 1, 2012**. A late fee of \$5.00 is assessed for each delinquent month. Licenses must be renewed every year by January 31<sup>st</sup>.

## HAMPTON TOWNSHIP RECYCLING SCHEDULE

**Recycling Schedule is being changed to a weekly pickup curbside every Wednesday throughout the entire Township.**

**NEWSPAPERS AND MAGAZINES WILL BE  
PICKED UP WITH RECYCLING ONLY**

Newspapers, Magazines, & other recyclables will be picked up once a week with Recycling. Do not put newspapers or magazines in paper or plastic bags. Recycling can be co-mingled and **MUST** be placed in containers that do not exceed 30 gallons.

**OTHER RECYCLABLE ITEMS INCLUDE:** Glass: Brown, Green, & Clear Containers, Tin Cans, Aluminum Cans, Pie Plates, Plastics\*\*, & Cardboard. Cardboard must be flattened & left out on **recycling** day.

\*\*Plastics that have the following symbols: P.E.T.1 Soda Bottles, H.D.P.E. 2 Milk, Juice, Water jugs, H.D.P.E. 2 Bleach, detergent, soap, shampoo bottles

\*\*\* If your regularly scheduled garbage or recycling day falls on a Holiday, it will be picked up on the following day!

**Electronic Waste Days**

**March 24, May 12, July 21, & October 13, 2012**

Limits: Up to 5 items for free/per vehicle. (computers, printers, TV's, VCR's, DVD & CD players, fax machines, copiers, radio & stereos, cell phones, & other electronic media devices.)

**How to minimize black bear conflicts**

- Reducing conflicts with bears is a community effort. It takes only several households with unsecured food to create a nuisance bear that could affect an entire neighborhood.
- Invest in bear-proof garbage containers. If not using bear-proof garbage containers, store all garbage in containers with tight fitting lids in a secure area such as a basement, a garage, or a shed.
- Wash garbage containers with a disinfectant at least once a week to eliminate odors. Draping ammonia or bleach soaked cloth over containers will help to eliminate odors.
- Put garbage out on collection day, not the evening before. Feed birds only Dec 1-Apr 1 when bears are least active.
- When feeding birds, suspend birdfeeders at least 10 feet off the ground. Clean up spilled seeds & shells daily.
- Feed outdoor pets during daylight hours only. Immediately remove all food scraps & bowls after feeding.
- Clean outdoor grills thoroughly after each use. Grease & food residue can attract bears.
- Do not place meat or sweet food scraps in compost piles. Don't leave food unattended while camping/picnicking.
- Never feed a black bear. It is dangerous & against the law. Report bear damage or nuisance behavior to the local police department or the Division of Fish & Wildlife at 877-927-6337.



## REGULAR AND BULK PICKUP - 2012

**REGULAR TRASH PICKUP** – Only two (2) 30 gallon containers of household waste will be picked up curbside weekly.

**BULK PICKUP** – Either (1) large bulk item, i.e. refrigerator, dishwasher etc. per week; **OR** one (1) 30 gallon container of bulk waste.

#### *Just as a reminder...*

The current contract with Waste Management states that **garbage can be picked up as early as 6 A.M.** Please have your garbage out by at least 6 a.m. on garbage day only. **The drivers are not subject to picking up at any specific time during the day.** So even if it seems that they come consistently at a certain time every week, **it could change on any given day** & it is important to have your garbage out at the specified time of 6 A.M.

#### Waste Management Will Not Pick Up the Following Bulk Items

1. Automobile Parts
2. Building Materials
3. Fuel Storage Containers
4. Televisions/ Computers

\* Bulk pick up is for Hampton Township Residents **Only**. Do not allow other individuals to bring their bulk garbage to your residence. This is considered illegal dumping and is a punishable offense.

#### Disposal Ban of Electronic Devices

Effective January 1, 2011, Waste Management is prohibited from picking up **Televisions, Computers, Monitors, & Portable/Laptop Computers**. SCMUA will hold two **Electronic Waste Disposal Days**. For more **Information please go to [www.scmua.org](http://www.scmua.org)**.
