There we will lay out our suggested itinerary for the evening.

From our meeting place we will venture out to the River Walk to shoot colorful decorations and holiday attractions.

Along our way we will get snacks and refreshments from the many vendors along the river walk.

No group meal is planned otherwise.

As twilight falls, we will position ourselves to make images of the colorful lights and riverside luminarias.

We will continue as we make our way toward the Alamo and complete our photos with

a night view of the Alamo and the traditional Christmas tree.



Tripods will be required for long exposures.

This will be a late field trip. You may plan for a return drive to Austin about 10:00 PM.

Carpooling among members is recommended but will not be organized by the club, per se.

NOTE: If bad weather threatens the field trip, a club-wide email will be distributed early Saturday morning.



2015 Assignments

January - Weather: An images that depicts weather but NOT a beautiful sunshiny day. Storm clouds, rain, sleet, snow, ice, wind, fog, rainbows are all acceptable.

March - Still Life: Make an artful arrangement of articles of your choosing, provide just the right light and photograph it. Last years "image of the year" by Barbara Hunley is an excellent example as are beautiful paintings of the old masters. Let your creative juices flow and create a "master piece".

May - Let's go shoot animals! Animal(s) Four legged, warm blooded animals. Not birds, reptiles or bugs! Your pet or a wild beast whatever suits your fancy. A portrait of a single animal or an animal family. Color, BW, or monochrome. Your choice.

July - Trees: Big trees, little trees, single tree, grove or row of trees. Just make the principle subject trees. They can be blooming, in fall color or have no leaves at all. Standing dead trees are acceptable. Color or monochrome.

September - Highways and Byways: A path, trail, sidewalk, road, street or highway serving as the leading lines into your image. Make it something that the viewer might want to travel on. Or it could be something daunting that might challenge them. The important thing is that draws them in to something beautiful, interesting or mystical. Color only

November - Wheels: A mode of transportation that is on wheels with the wheels being the main point of interest. Trains, bicycles, tricycles, motorbike/cycle, cars (old or new) trucks are all fair game as well as anything else you find that is on wheels and provides transportation. Color or Black & White

Leadership Meeting

Dolph McCranie attended Brian's Macro Workshop and gives us a report:

It was excellent as are most everything that Brian does.

The first day we met at 1 PM For a lecture by Brian all about the true definition of macro: being that the object being photographed is the same size on the sensor as it is in life a one to one ratio. He then went on about ideal equipment and technique.

The next day we were able to practice putting his lectures to work. We had a set up for each photographer with props, stands, clamps etc. that Brian supplied. After getting set up

with our cameras on tripods, hopefully with a macro slider, we went out to collect some subjects, such as flowers, lichen or even insects. We then were able to release our artistic selves and photograph these objects at 1/1 by moving the camera to focus rather than using the focus ring on the lens. Very educational.

The next half day was more of the same with a lecture on focus stacking and macro panoramas.

The accommodations at the Mo Ranch were fine and we ate in the ranch cafeteria which served typical cafeteria food. Not wonderful but adequate.

All in all I would highly recommend the workshop for anyone wishing to increase their macro skills and knowledge.

Vice President-Programs Pete Holland called the meeting to order at 7:04 pm, in the absence of the President. Two visitors were welcomed by Pete.

Pete inquired if everyone was getting a newsletter by email. He announced the club website had been hacked and does not work.

Refreshments for the evening were provided by Beverly Lyle and Barbara Hunley.

Treasurer Paul Munch reported the club has \$3,010.62 in its checking account, of which \$2,210.62 is available to spend. Reserved is \$800 for the annual December awards banquet. He passed the blue envelope for visitors interested in joining and any contact changes for existing members. Beverly McCranie told members the banquet would be held Thursday evening, December 4, at Tres Amigos on Loop 360 at a cost of \$20/person. The club will provide dessert.

Saturday's workshop "Tack Sharp" will be conducted by Wes Odell. Attendees will not need to bring their cameras.

Pete introduced the speaker, Alex Labry. He is an active blogger (www.blogart.co) and his website is www.alexlabry.com. He is from New Orleans and holds a BA in Photography, graduating from St. Edwards magna cum laude. He also has a master's in

Fine Arts from UT. He was previously photography director at the Texas House of Representatives and a past president of the Texas Photographic Society.

Alex talked about his background. He was a businessman making a lot of money, but one day he fell in love with photography, and went back to school to learn. He felt he was born to be a photographer. His work is traditional, and he uses Leica equipment. His work will be shown in the near future at ProJex Gallery in Austin, and he is publishing a book on his "Joan of Arc" project. He prints his own images using an Epson 7900 with Hahnemuhle paper and more recently Epson Photo Rag.

After his presentation, he answered questions from the audience.

President Brian Loflin had arrived a few minutes late, and told members after the program the November meeting will include a review of the Salado scavenger hunt photos. He will be sending out instructions for participants. Images will be brought to the meeting on flash drives and will be voted on by attendees.

Pete announced that Alex had prints to show to interested members after the meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:25 pm.
