Growing and Knowing the Tree of Life at Palestine and BeyondWith Pastor Eric


(Jesus said) Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. – John 12:24

Through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. – Revelations 22:2

We are at the beginning of the Easter season which walks almost hand-in-hand with the springtime. The season of Easter moves for seven weeks from the bare ground into the growing and budding plants in our gardens and fields around us. Living in rural America we are aware of the seasons and the cycles of life within them. There is a season for everything in God's creation (Ecclesiastes 3:1). Through Holy Week we remember that after the death of Jesus came the burial in the earthen tomb and eventually the resurrection of Jesus to life everlasting. Jesus teaches a great deal in parables around planting seeds and caring for fig trees and weeding gardens. Each story has an expectation of growth and death, a beginning and an ending in them. These stories mirror our very existence which is why they follow us through the centuries season unto season. Our congregation goes through seasons as well and for us planting gives way to growing. Tending to the growth takes work and attention from everyone in this place. God gifts each of us with the tools to plant, prune and nourish that which is planted. We will consider what it means to grow in Christ and reflect on the Tree of Life images in the Scriptures during this Easter season. It is my prayer for you that as we consider Jesus as the branch raised up for us that we invest what the Holy Spirit plants in us to nurture the Tree of Life here in this place among this people.

Let us pray. Heavenly Father, who sows and reaps the seed of life and brings rain and sun to nourish and grow, plant in me the seed of love and service, equip me to help and nurture in healthy ways, and empower me to grow with you and in you always as a reflection of your light and love, in Jesus' name. Amen.

A Branch Raised Up



An Easter Series on Redemption and Bearing Fruit Join us for a special series of four worship services called A Branch Raised Up. Each service in the fourpart series focuses on

Christ as the Branch raised up and ties that theme to our bearing fruit for him in various ways.

Service One highlights Jeremiah 33:15 "I will cause a righteous branch to spring up" and relates that verse to Christ who came to raise up our fallen race by covering us with his righteousness so that we might be saved and grow in him."

<u>Service Four</u> highlights Revelation 2:7 "To the one who conquers I will grant to eat of the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God" and focuses on the rich and fruitful life of heaven that awaits all who have been washed in the blood of the Lamb.



National Child Abuse Prevention

According to the lowa Department of Human Services, 8,892 lowa children were found to be abused in 2016. The most common forms of abuse included denial of critical care, physical injury, exposure to illegal drugs and sexual abuse.

Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI) helps combat child abuse through prevention, safety, and stability services, as well as mental and behavioral health treatment.

Through regular in-home visits to families, LSI's Early Childhood Services prevent child abuse by giving parents the support, education, and resources they need to build a healthy, stable home for their children. In 2017, our Early Childhood programs provided more than 15,000 in-home visits to families.

LSI's Family Safety, Risk, and Permanency Services help children and families already involved in a crisis or abuse situation to become safer and more stable, and LSI's Bremwood and Beloit Residential Treatment Centers serve many children and youth who have experienced trauma from past abuse or neglect.

Building a Stronger Family

Stacy's daughter, Danikah, was a happy and playful toddler. But things began to change when her baby brother, Parker, was born. She was happy to see him in the hospital at first, but she struggled to adjust to a new child at home, especially when it came to sharing a room with Parker.

Stacy found LSI's New Parent Program shortly after Parker was born, and she hoped it could help her daughter adjust to the changes at home. The free, voluntary program provides support and education to families during and after pregnancy. Through the program, Stacy gets to meet other families in her community, and Danikah gets to interact with other children who have siblings.

Danikah is learning how other siblings share their toys & interact. Meanwhile, Stacy is learning to adjust to her children's developmental stages. Through the program, she has learned to potty train Danikah & manage her daughter's temper tantrums.

At home, Stacy and her children receive regular visits from their LSI team. Each week, the team brings creative new crafts Stacy can make from materials around the house. Danikah, now 5, is always eager to learn a new activity from her LSI worker during each visit. She's even starting to share her homemade toys with Parker.

"The program is fun for the kids, but you can also do things as a family," Stacy says. "You get that time with your child, and you're building a better relationship in the process."

Session four: The Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-20)

This month's study continues to look at how Bible stories mean different things to different people. In this session, we consider how the story of the Prodigal Son is understood by believers—indeed by Lutheran believers—in different parts of the world.
