

### FORT UMPQUA DAYS REPORT by Lorraine Hayden

Elkton Community Education Center was finally able to resume their Fort Umpqua Days celebration Labor Day weekend.

Bruce Cameron provided a parade float with his Civil War Mountain Howitzer mounted on a trailer while we passed out candy and toys he provided. At noon he and the blacksmith each fired blanks from their cannons for a demonstration.

I manned the trade counter in the Granary building with friend Troy Dunham helping on Saturday and former member Rick O'Nion on Sunday. A club information table was set up in the demonstration area behind the fort and folks helped themselves to the various handouts.

Six camps were set up for demonstrations (beading, weaving, spinning, spoon carving, music sign language and gold mining) by re-enactor friends down from Washington State. They all love the opportunity for Living History outreach and the mission of Fort Umpqua, so they happily traveled down to participate in the event.

Kids were kept busy fulfilling tasks to complete their Hudson's Bay Company work contracts and were given payment in trinkets from the trade store. The Barracks building was closed due to an infestation of endangered bats, but the Bat Man was due to start mitigation and remove them the following Tuesday. There was a good turn-out of the public and all were very happy to have the fort bustling with activity again after Covid shutdown.

HARVEST MOON ENCAMPMENT: The dates are October 6-9 at Fort Umpqua. This is a primitive encampment but with a tin-tipi camp around the corner. We don't do a mass mailing of fliers but send them to past participants and those interested in attending. #### SHOOT REPORT FOR AUGUST 27, 2022

Our sponsor this month was Dave Johnson. This is the first one he's done for us, and he handled it like a pro! We had eleven in attendance with 8 participants.

The first target was on 8.5"X11" paper. There were two colored lines. The narrow one (about an inch) was 10 points while the wider one (about 3") was 5. The second one was 5 Smiley Faces with one shot each. There were 5 points for the face and 10 points for the teeth. The third was five Bulls-eyes; a big one in the middle and smaller ones in each corner. The scoring was the usual, 10X, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, and 5 points for the larger one and 10X, 10, and 9 for the smaller ones. The fourth was a double Bulls-eye (side by side). Each one had two rings with a 10-point center and a 5-point outer. This was ten shots (five in each). The last one was a five-shot "Bug Splat" similar to what I did in July. I believe the distance was 25 yards, but we may have moved the frames in for the condiment packages.

I want to thank the following people: Dave Johnson for a fun and challenging match, Melody Morrell for scoring targets, her husband Bob for collecting them and taking them to her, Deb Eikenberry and Dave Johnson for the additional photos! We finished the event with chili and more fellowship in the Multi-purpose Building. 10 points for 8 ring or better—ie a kill shot

## Second Target: Bulls eye: Rifle or Trade Gun or one target each

25 yards—Five shots rifle or Trade Gun:

Points per standard scoring

# Third Target: Battleship: Pistol

Print on 8 1/2in x 11in paper

10 Yards—Ten shots Pistol

5 points for each ship sunk—hits much touch black dots

Minus one point for any shot not touching a ship

### Forth Target: Squirrel: Any Muzzleloader

Print on 8 1/2in x 11in paper
