LD 23 Special Meeting/General Meeting Minutes Scottsdale Civic Center Library, Scottsdale January 9, 2014 5:30 Credentials, 7:00 pm Meeting

With concurrence of the members present, the Special Meeting of the Members of Arizona Republican Legislative District 23, held at Civic Center Library, located at 3839 N Drinkwater Blvd, Scottsdale, Arizona 85251 on January 9, 2014 was called to order by Chairman Doug Little at 7:10 pm.

The Invocation was given by Dr. C.T. Wright and the Pledge was led by Christopher Campbell.

The Chairman announced there were only two pieces of business that would be conducted at this meeting. Those are the approval of the Minutes from the November meeting and the Treasurer's Report.

Secretary's Report and Approval/Corrections to the Minutes from November meeting: The Minutes were approved as presented.

Treasurer's Report:

The Treasurer's report was given by Linda Rizzo. Joe Meli made a motion to accept the report as presented, Kathy Littlefield seconded. The report was approved as presented.

Presentation of Award:

Outgoing Chairman Little was very appreciative of the award presented to him and said he wanted everyone to get together behind our candidates. He talked briefly about Tom Buggeln, a long-time and active member who passed away in 2013. Tom worked hard every day whether he was thrilled with the candidates or not, setting a good example for all of us.

Chairman's announcement:

The Chairman asked that everyone please stay at the meeting for the vote to maintain a quorum and please don't fold the ballot. He also thanked George Teegarden and Tom Husband for being there to handle the balloting and counting.

Preliminary Report of the Credentials Committee:

Secretary Lynne Breyer reported at 8:10 pm there were 159 PCs in attendance in person, 75 PCs in attendance by Proxy for a total preliminary attendance of 236 PCs.

Other announcements:

Senator Michele Reagan reported that she expects a busy Legislative session. She expects they will address the Dark Money issue and will try to tighten up the disclosure requirements.

Chairman Little explained how the process would work. Ray Wallage was appointed to be the timekeeper.

Final Credentials Committee Report: Secretary Lynne Breyer reported at 8:20 that the final tally was 159 PCs present in person, 81 PCs present by Proxy for a total of 240 PCs in attendance.

Report of the Nominating Committee:

Laddie Shane reported there were two declared candidates for the office of LD23 Chairman: Joe Meli and Sheila Meuhling. Both candidates were approved by the Nominating Committee.

Election of New Chairman:

*Nominations from the Floor: The Chairman called three times for nominations from the floor.

*Hearing none, Mark Lewis moved that nominations be closed, the motion was seconded by Kathy Littlefield and the nominations were closed.

*Candidate Remarks, 5 minutes each, were presented from the podium. The order was by coin toss. Sheila Meuhling began first with Joe Meli to follow.

*Balloting began at 8:25.

*Tally and Announcement of results:

Joe Meli received 136 votes, Sheila Muehling received 99 votes.

Voting Results:

Be it Resolved that Joe Meli won the election and becomes the new Chairman to fill out the unexpired term of Doug Little.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:50 pm.

The swearing in of the new Chairman immediately followed adjournment of the meeting as provided in the By-Laws.
