Guidance for Communal Worship during the COVID-19
Pandemic As of 17 May 2021 we are at Step 3 of the
Government's COVID-19 Response Roadmap. The

- 1. Face coverings Use of face coverings remains a legal requirement at the present time.
- 2. Offertory procession can take place, those involved sanitising their hands before.
- 3. Communion in the hand recommended; however, Communion on the tongue can take place, so long as those who wish to receive on the tongue are at the back of the queue. Not recommended if there is a local surge in infections.
- 4. Sunday collection may take place with volunteers holding the basket and moving around church (but not baskets passed-around the congregation).
- 5. Stewarding requirement dropped for weekday Mass and private prayer. Stewards only needed on Sundays and major services (and possibly larger funerals). Cleaning of benches required.
- 6. Capacity: Some flexibility in the assessment of safe capacity of a church (e.g. possible to safely drop to 1m+ with mitigation).
- 7. Track and Trace remains in place, though on weekdays, those visiting church need to take personal responsibility for signing-in either on the sheet or on the NHS QR code displayed at the back of church. To assist stewards cleaning, please place a laminated

card 'Bench to be Cleaned' on the bench you sit at.

Seating at Sunday Mass - a request from the stewards

It's lovely to see people returning to Sunday Mass in church. We need to maintain social distancing to keep everyone safe particularly those who are most vulnerable. Some Sundays it is difficult to find some families a place to sit together, so we need to make better use of the space we have. So we ask:

single people to either sit on a chair in the side aisles OR to sit in a bench occupied by one other person.. If every single person sits on a separate bench we lose capacity for families. This way we can safely welcome everyone who comes. Thank you for your understanding.

Next OPC will be held on Weds 23rd June, 7pm at Westby.

This year, the eyes of the world are on the UK as we host two major international meetings: the G7 summit in June and the UN climate talks in November. At CAFOD we know that change happens when enough of us come together to take action and raise our collective voices - your voice and action matters. So we are asking you to support CAFOD's Reclaim Our Common Home Campaign this year by signing a petition to the Prime Minister urging him to show the ambition we need to protect our common home and end the climate crisis. - 8. Home Visits: A reasonable number of home visits per day with Holy Communion can take place, including by extra-ordinary ministers.
- 9. Funerals mourners can attend up to the church's safe capacity. The 30 person rule is dropped.
- 10. Baptisms standalone baptisms with up to 30 persons can take place.
- 11. Weddings up to 30 persons present (30 includes the couple, but not anyone 'working' at the event).
