These are the words of the 2018 National FFA theme song that echoed throughout the Central DeWitt High School gymnasium as 400 high school students found their spot on the bleachers. The DeWitt Central FFA chapter was wrapping up one of the best FFA Week celebrations in history and was ready to spread their excitement to the rest of their fellow classmates.

"Today, so many people are unaware of where their food is actually coming from," said Skylar Bloom. For students in the DeWitt Central FFA Chapter, National FFA Week is yet another opportunity to teach their community about agriculture and how it plays a vital role in everyday life.

On Thursday, February 22, 2018, FFA members hosted an interactive "Farm to Plate" assembly that educated Central DeWitt students about five agricultural industries.

was focused on a race between five school clubs (FFA, FCCLA, GSA, Robotics and Speech Club). With two students representing each club, the activity consisted of three challenges that each gave insight into how the food found in the grocery store, is actually

produced on many different farms.

In round one, students had to maneuver their way through five "obstacles" that each represented an agriculture industry (e.g. a "milking a cow" simulation represented the dairy industry.) The three fastest teams to complete all five obstacles then moved on to round two, where students had to answer ten agricultural trivia questions. In the end, the FFA Organization and Speech Club advanced to the third, and final round, where both representatives had to eat a meal with five different foods from five different agriculture industries. Each team was served one corn dog (pork industry), an ear of corn (corn industry), one boiled egg (poultry industry), two fish sticks (aquaculture industry) and a glass of milk (dairy industry). The winner of the entire race was the Speech Club who received a "pineapple trophy."
