Dear Church Family and Friends,

Sooo... are there more changes in store? Probably! But the changes that I am hoping are ahead will be much more internal. The building and programs are ready to welcome everyone, but how ready are we to accept the stranger? I mean establishing a friendly relationship with our neighbors who don't "do Church." I challenge everyone to target one person or family who needs God (who doesn't?). Of course a goal can be to bring them into the church family. If you believe we have a wonderful place to worship and a loving church family, let's not keep this a secret. Do you remember the statistic I quoted a few Sundays ago, 82% of unchurched people are somewhat likely to come to church if invited.<u>..82%!</u> People are truly just waiting to be invited! However, the most important goal is to let them see the love of God in you. It is likely that they will want what you have, who wouldn't want to know why you are peaceful, loving, joyful and hopeful? Invite these friends to come in a non-threatening way and including them in the life of the church. You don't have to be a predator, just offer the invitation. And then, help them to become part of the church family if that is their wish. It might mean giving rides, mentoring them in "church" language, following through for many weeks or even months until they are established in their own relationship with God.

Matthew 25:37-40 "Then those 'sheep' are going to say, 'Master, what are you talking about? When did we ever see you hungry and feed you, thirsty and give you a drink? And when did we ever see you sick or in prison and come to you?' Then the King will say, 'I'm telling the solemn truth: Whenever you did one of these things to someone overlooked or ignored, that was me_you did it to me.'

Let's learn how to really be the church, wherever we are.

Emergency Preparedness

September is Emergency Preparedness Month. Disaster can strike anyone, anywhere at any time. Natural disasters such as floods, hurricanes, tornados, blizzards, ice storms and earthquakes often wreak havoc on large areas. Man-made disasters such as chemical spills, explosions and plane crashes affect smaller areas but often require emergency evacuations that can last a week or more.

Sadly, experience shows that when disaster strikes, many households are totally unprepared for either being without utilities and services, or, an emergency evacuation for multiple days.

Being unprepared means, at the very least,

risking considerable discomfort for multiple days, and at the very worst,

risking your health and even death.

Emergency officials urge that every household should <u>at least</u> be prepared for:

1. Being stranded at home without utilities for 3 to 5 days.

2. Having to evacuate within 5 minutes and not return for <u>at least</u> 72 hours.

3. Being stranded overnight in a vehicle.
