The year-long institute's goal is to strengthen Kentucky's Population Health by improving the skills of the individuals working in the health sector including public health, health systems, and community partners. The life-changing personal and professional development experience produces skills, confidence, problem-solving abilities and connections essential to realizing leadership potential in our communities.

Fellows completing the program are awarded a certificate in Population Health Leadership.

All curriculum elements are based on individual learner development needs using the leadership development competency framework. Individual scholars form into teams or come as a team to work on health problems using systems thinking and quality improvement tools taught by institute faculty by completing a **Change Master Project**.

Scholars also develop an **Individual Development Plan** for the year informed by feedback gathered through leadership development tools and instruments facilitated by institute faculty and mentors.

There is no cost to attend the institute, however, your agency must cover the cost of your travel which includes 7-night stays at state parks (approx. \$70 per night).
