Mentor Farmers Market to Open as Scheduled

The amended Ohio Department of Health Director's Stay at Home Order signed on April 2, 2020, identified farmers markets, along with farm and produce stands, as essential businesses and as such may open when following required guidelines.

The Mentor Farmers Market will open as scheduled on Friday, June 26th from 2:00 PM to 6:00 PM at Garfield Park, 7967 Mentor Avenue.

"We are happy to be able to support our local farmers and to offer this service to Mentor residents," says Kenn Kaminski, Director of Mentor Parks and Recreation, "The Mentor Farmers Market offers an opportunity for residents to purchase freshpicked fruits and vegetables along with farm related items like honey, baked goods, flowers, and teas."

To ensure the safety of shoppers, vendors and city staff, modifications to the weekly farmers market will include:

• Designated six-foot distances between people

Specifically, MPL offers drivethru service at its Main Branch and curbside pickup of library items from its Lake and Headlands Branches. Patrons need to place items on hold before they can be picked up. People can call the library to put items on hold or they can place holds online at www.mentorpl.org. (Patrons need their library card number and PIN to sign in.)

Curbside and drive-thru pickup is available during Mentor Public Library's regular hours on Monday through Sunday until 15 minutes before the branch closes. all items returned in its dropoff boxes.



Bankruptcy 1

Bankruptcy Made Simple

The two types of bankruptcy that most people hear about are chapter 7 and chapter 13. The word chapter refers to the chapter (like in a book) in the bankruptcy code. Chapter 7 is a liquidating bankruptcy and chapter 13 is a non-liquidating bankruptcy. Liquidating means they (the government) can take your stuff. Non-liquidating means they can't. However, there are exceptions to this. I will try to lay this out in a simple fashion:

In a chapter 7 you will be able to discharge all of your debts without paying anything back. However, if you have any equity (value) in anything (your home, your car, your bank account, your boat- anything) you must surrender it to the bankruptcy trustee (the person who looks out for the creditors) so that it can be sold (liquidated) to pay back the creditors to the largest extent possible. Equity is what

determines which chapter of bankruptcy you can file under. Market Value minus Fair Amount Owed equals Your Equity in anything.

A chapter 13 is a nonliquidating bankruptcy. This means you get to keep everything but you have to pay back a percentage of your debt. It is also used for people who are in foreclosure or behind on their mortgage and in fear of foreclosure. A chapter 13 requires a payback plan from between three to five years. The payment is monthly. The amount is determined, again, by the amount of non-exempt equity you have accumulated in your life. Exempt equity is equity that the law says your creditors cannot take. Nonexempt means they can take it. Your total equity is referred to as your bankruptcy estate. Obviously, everyone wants to do a chapter 7 because it is no pay back. However, since 2005 it has become much harder to file

What is Medicare Part D?

cost of prescription drugs. This coverage is offered to everyone who has Medicare. To qualify you must be enrolled in Medicare Parts A and/or B. This program is not mandatory. If you do not enroll in a prescription drug plan when first eligible you may pay a late enrollment penalty when you decide to enroll. There are a couple

Medicare Part D helps with the exceptions. One is if you receive Extra Help from Medicare and the other is if you have other creditable prescription drug coverage. The late enrollment penalty is 1% of the national base beneficiary premium for every month that you could have had a drug plan but didn't. The national base beneficiary premium for 2020 is \$32.74.

Prescription Drug Plans are

offered through private insurance companies. You can get them as a stand alone product or though a Medicare Advantage plan. Every prescription drug plan has a formulary which is a list of covered drugs under a prescription drug plan. The medications are broken down into tier levels. Generally, the lower the tier level, the lower the cost of the medication. They also may have a network of preferred pharmacies.

Part D plans have four coverage stages. The annual deductible is the first stage. The deductible can be up to \$435 for 2020. The deductible can apply to all tier levels or only a few depending on the plan. The second stage is the initial coverage stage. During this stage you pay a copay or coinsurance for your medication. Once you and the drug plan have spent \$4020 in 2020, then you move into the third stage, the coverage gap. Many people stay in the initial coverage stage for the whole year and never enter the coverage gap. If you are receiving

Extra Help you will not enter the coverage gap. During the coverage gap you'll pay no more than 25% of the cost for generic and brand name medications. When your total out of pocket has reached \$6350 then you enter the final stage, catastrophic. During the catastrophic phase you pay 5% or a small copay or coinsurance for the rest of the year.

Many prescription drug plans have rules such as quantity limits, step therapy, prior authorization to name a few.

You can also reach out to your agent/broker, health insurance provider for more details.







Can UVC Kill the Novel Coronavirus?

The Coronavirus disease, or COVID-19, is a virus that is mostly transmitted through the air in water droplets found in coughs and sneezes by those infected. UVC irradiation has the ability to kill any kind of bacteria or virus. The COVID-19 virus is 0.1 microns in size making it highly susceptible to UV-C (https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/).

The amount of UVC necessary to kill virus varies from virus to virus.

Here are a few examples measured in Microwatt Seconds per Square Centimeter.

Adeno Virus Type III 3 - 4,500

Bacteriophage 1,3,4,5,6,9 - 6.600

Coxsackie - 6,300

Influenza 1,2,3,4,5,7,9 - 6,600

Infectious Hepatitis 1,5,7,9 - 8 000

As you can see some are easier to kill than others, but all are killed by UVC.

What we do know is it takes a considerable UV dose to kill germs and virus. The principle of UVC sterilization is related to intensity of the lamps used. The more powerful the lamp the better the kill. The slower the air is moving the better the kill.

All One Hour UVC products are designed to meet or exceed the design parameters set forth by Westinghouse. We need a 110 Microwatt lamp in an airflow up to 2400 CFM to get a 70 to 85% kill in a duct system. The lamp intensity is measured at one meter from the lamp. As germs get closer to the lamp the intensity increases. Two inches from the

lamp we have 5,814 microwatts. We can't block the UVC with any type of cell or screen causing a shadowing effect. The light must irradiate up and down the duct to give us time and distance to allow the germs to absorb the UVC light as they flow through the duct.

If a customer is trying to protect their family from spreading germs around their home through their HVAC system we would recommend installing one of the One Hour dual lamp units (see chart). Putting two high microwatt lamps in the duct will produce 360 microwatts of UVC. That will be more than three times the Westinghouse recommended intensity necessary to get an 80% single pass kill. It's not even important to kill viruses but simply deactivate or sterilize them so they can't reproduce.

The chart below is a guide to achieving an 80% kill rate using a 110 microwatt lamp. All One Hour 16" UVC lamps produce 180 microwatts each

There's More to Mold Than Just the Spore!

When particular molds colonize and they progress through their life cycle they emit a gas (musty smell). As the reservoir of fungus grows to several billion spores in the colony, our noses detect the smell of these fungal gases.

When a closed indoor

environment continues to fill with the mycotoxic gases, they can become a health risk. The affect it has on the human body is dependent on three variables. Our individual immune systems, the type of spore and the volume of fungal gas, determines the impact on our bodies.

exposure to these gases, the greater the likely hood we will develop a sensitivity. Much like other environmental allergens we are exposed to, the longer the exposure, the greater the chance our bodies will have an adverse reaction.

Some health effects include, headaches, shortness of breath, dizziness, lethargy, fever, and digestive problems. More severe reactions are hypersensitivity, and asthma symptoms. Although rare, certain Aspergillus species release aflatoxins that are carcinogenic.

There are many things in life we cannot control, but exposure to fungal gases is not one of them. With a little effort, we can reduce or eliminate this health hazard by using a disinfectant or removing the affected material. In some instances, it may be necessary to seek a professional opinion or get professional help.

DIVORCE 101:

Divorce v. Dissolution: What is the difference?

This article simplistically identifies the main issues in the termination of the marital contract and explains the difference between a divorce and dissolution and why a dissolution is always the best, least stressful and most cost-effective means to terminate the marital contract.

The issues in either a dissolution or divorce are the same. They are as follows: (1.) Allocation of Parental Rights and Responsibilities, if there are children. The main issues regarding the allocation of parental rights and responsibilities would include who pays child support and how much, companionship time (formerly "visitation"), has custody or how is shared (formerly parenting "joint custody") to be allocated, who is responsible for health care/ insurance and how will the tax exemption be divided.

(2.) Spousal support. Will one party pay the other spousal support and how much and for how long?

- (3.) Property distribution. How will the marital real and personal property and all other marital assets be divided.
- (4.) Pension and retirement division, if in existence. And, finally,
- (5.) Allocation of marital debt. These are the main issues in every divorce and/or dissolution.

The most fundamental difference between a contested divorce and a dissolution is that in a contested divorce the parties cannot agree on one or more of the issues whereas in a dissolution the parties must agree on ALL issues. Dissolutions are very cost effective. The cost of the dissolution varies based upon the number of issues in the case (listed above). The cost of a dissolution is dramatically less than a divorce (the parties cannot agree on one or more of the issues). The average cost of a divorce with children in Ohio is \$18,800 and without children \$12,500 (Lawyers.com survey). The average cost of a dissolution with children is \$5000 and without children \$4000. Most

importantly, the emotional cost of a prolonged divorce is high to both parties and children.

Dissolutions are fast. dissolution can be finalized in as little as six-weeks from the filing date and, usually, requires only one hearing. An action for divorce- if the parties cannot come to a voluntary agreement- can easily take a year or longer to finalize. There are several hearings and a trial. The information gathering process referred to as "discovery" can become a costly and stressful nightmare. Discovery is not required in a dissolution. In divorce, there is the dread of runaway attorney fees averaging \$300-\$500 per hour. There is always the worry (which is justified) that the attorney will quit if you run out of money or the fear of receiving another several thousand-dollar bill unexpectedly. Almost everyone has heard a horror story about attorney fees.

At Biales Delchin Law, dissolution is a flat fee. Our clients don't worry about getting a huge hourly bill after the initial payment.

The emotional price of continuous daily resentment, depression, fear and worry can become overbearing and destructive to one's health. Dissolution avoids all of this. That being said; It is very difficult to get two people who are usually not the best of friends- to begin with- to agree on all issues. All issues must be agreed to for a successful dissolution to occur. This requires compromise. The cardinal rule is that nobody walks away happy. Each party usually feels wronged in some way by the other. Each party usually feels that they could have obtained a better result if they would have just held out longer or been more aggressive. The truth is the law is pretty settled on how property and children are resolved. In most cases, you will not get a better result by engaging in prolonged divorce litigation.

If the parties are unable to come to an agreement regarding all the issues, as is often the case, a divorce must be initiated. I try to resolve as many issues as possible before hand and communicate with the other party or his/her attorney to coordinate the process. It is always best to work together and focus upon resolution of the issues on which the parties agree. The purpose of the attorney is to make the process as minimally painful, and least expensive as possible. Open and honest communication is key. Unfortunately, in many cases, the parties have so much resentment toward each other that they are simply unable to cooperate. This is never in anybody's best interest and can be very damaging to children.

There are certainly ways to minimize the pain and cost of a divorce, but it will never be as efficient and emotionally healthy as two parties coming to a voluntary agreement with dissolution. I believe that a dissolution really should be possible in most cases if two factors are present (1.) the parties are mature, sensitive and intelligent and (2.) the matter is approached with a cost versus benefit business analysis, an open mind and sound professional guidance. I know this is easier said than done. But- if accomplished- the financial and emotional rewards (including healing time) reaped are enormous for the parties and children and will be enjoyed for the span of one's entire life.




