thereof: <i>and</i> the in spirit <i>is</i> better than the in spirit.
Anyone awake for philosophy this morning? That text above and many others is
what the book of Ecclesiastes is about; it is a wise man's look on life from an
earthly standpoint. WARNING – it is quite pointed!

Pr **29**:1 He, that being often reproved hardeneth *his* neck, shall suddenly be destroyed, and that without remedy.

Looking at this text from a physical standpoint "hardeneth his neck," you can't turn your head and it would be uncomfortable. Considering it from a mental and emotional stance, it might lead to 'anxiety tunnel vision' because of less peripheral vision, only the problem or corrective statement is focused on.

Considering it from biblical comparison, I'm sure you've read the expression "stiffnecked." It was spoken of the children of Israel when they made a molten calf and worshipped it. Ex. 32

That expression was spoken by the Lord Himself even on a couple other occasions. Moses picked up on it and told the people that's what they were. He was a caring and sharing pastor of the flock but not a flatterer. If they were out of line he reproved them. He prayed for them and God held back His hand of judgment.

Pr 29:5 A man that flattereth his neighbour spreadeth a net for his feet.

Moses, *Elihu*, Hezekiah, Stephen and the Apostle Paul wouldn't use flattering titles. Should a minister today? *¿Elihu – I know that name...?* 

Here again in **2Ch** 30:8 Now be ye not stiffnecked, as your fathers *were*, *but* yield yourselves unto the LORD, and enter into his sanctuary, which he hath sanctified for ever: and serve the LORD your God, that the fierceness of his wrath may turn away from you.

Summery: How many times do we have to be corrected for the same thing?

When the reproof comes and is not accepted and acted upon the rebellious spirit grows stronger and eventually the axe will fall. The nation of Israel is proof of that. Pharaoh is proof of that. The elders of Succoth learned that.

Judges 8:16 And he took the elders of the city, and thorns of the wilderness and briers, and with them he taught the men of Succoth.
