Argentina celebrates Valentine's Day as "the week of sweetness" in July, and celebrants exchange kisses, chocolates, and other sweets. ♥ It is believed that the first Valentine's Day card originated in **France**, when Charles the Duke of Orleans sent love letters to his wife from prison in 1415. One can also see beautiful yards, trees, and homes decorated with cards, roses, and proposals of marriage. ♥ **South Korea** celebrates the day of love on the 14th of each month, with "the day of roses" in May, "the day of kisses" in June, "the day of hugs in December" and single people celebrate "the black day" in April by eating black noodles. ♥ **Bulgaria** celebrates San Trifon Zartan on Valentine's Day, which means "day of winemakers" and couples celebrate their love with a glass of wonderful local wine. ♥ As far back as the 16th century, **Wales** has been celebrating Valentine's Day on Jan 25th, which is called the "day of San Dwywnen" and lovers exchange unique and beautifully handcrafted wooden spoons. ♥ The day of love in **Spain** falls on October 9th and is known as the feast of Saint Dionysus. The festival is celebrated by the men making marzipan figurines for their sweethearts and there are also colorful parades in the streets. ♥ In **China**, the "Sisters' Meal" festival is celebrated on March 15th. Women wear silver accessories and beautiful dresses and they cook various dishes of colored rice that is offered on silk fabric to young men. Two chopsticks mean love and a clove of garlic means the love is over before it has even begun. ♥ Valentine's Day in **Denmark** is celebrated with the exchange of handmade cards with pressed white flowers they call snowdrops. ♥ *(continued on back page.)*

In **Romania**, the day is celebrated on February 24th, as the day when young couples get engaged. It is basically a mix of Valentine's Day and the celebration of the spring season. Young men and women go to the forests to pick colorful flowers, while other couples wash their faces with snow as a sign of good luck. ♥ In the **Czech Republic**, Valentine's Day is celebrated on May 1st, and young couples kiss under the cherry trees for good luck. ♥ The "Dia dos Namorados" festival, also known as "Lovers Day", is celebrated in **Brazil**. There is a usual exchange of chocolates, cards, and flowers, while celebrating at music festivals with dance performances. ♥ On Valentine's Day in **England**, women place five bay leaves on their pillows to bring dreams of their future husbands. ♥ In **Italy**, a Valentine's Day tradition was for young, unmarried women to wake up before dawn to spot their future husband. Today, however, Italians celebrate by exchanging gifts and sharing a romantic dinner. ♥ In **Slovenia**, St. Valentine is one of the patron Saints of spring. It is believed that on February 14th, plants start to regenerate as this day marks the first day of working in the fields for the New Year. Another popular belief is that birds "propose" to each other on this day and in order to witness this occasion, one must walk barefoot through fields that are often still frozen. ♥

Chocolate Covered Cherry Kiss

1 cup Ice
1.5 oz Chocolate Vodka
1.5 oz Cherry Vodka
½ oz Grenadine Syrup
1 oz Crème de Cacao
1 oz Half-and-Half
1 dash Chocolate Syrup
Maraschino Cherry
Hershey's Chocolate Kiss

Fill a cocktail shaker with ice cubes. Pour in chocolate and cherry vodkas, grenadine, creme de cacao, half-and-half, and chocolate syrup. Cover and shake until the outside of the shaker has frosted. Strain into a chilled martini glass, garnish with maraschino cherry and chocolate kiss, and serve. ♥
