

DISCOURAGED SHORT PLANT LIST

Some plants that are invasive, a fire risk, or have a low wildlife value and displace native plants.

Trees



Tree of Heaven *Ailanthus altissima* "I" - Invasive.
Alternative Trees: Goldenrain Tree & Black Walnut

Eucalyptus *Eucalyptus globules* Not for safe
Firescapes. Alt. trees: Deodar Cedar & Cottonwood

Shrubs



Scotch Broom *Cytisus scoparius* "I" - Invasive.
Alternative Plants: Dwarf Coyote Bush & Flannel Bush

Chamise *Adenostoma fasciculatum* Not for safe
firescaping. Alternative Plants: Wild Lilac or Redbud

Ground Covers



Vinca (Periwinkle) *Vinca major* "I" - Invasive.
Alternative Plants: Honeysuckle & Pipevine

English Ivy *Hedera helix* "I" - Invasive. Snails &
Rats. Alternative Plants: Pipe Vine & Honeysuckle

These plants are discouraged from being shared, sold or allowed to spread because they are invasive, displace native plants or because they do not make fire safe landscapes. 

Native & High Value Plants

The City of Placerville assembled this sampler to identify native plants & high value plants that provide for special City needs. Native plants ensure that there are natural features in our man-made environment and ensure that during severe droughts some of the landscape will survive. Plants that serve special needs are trees in parking lots, are ideal for lining sidewalks, grow in planters, are fast growing, can grow under power lines without having to be pruned annually, screen unsightly views such as propane tanks and provide buffering. Also, included are plants that are disease resistant and native plants that provide a high wildlife value (food and/or shelter). Also included are plants that have a historical and signature look that says "we are in Placerville."
