

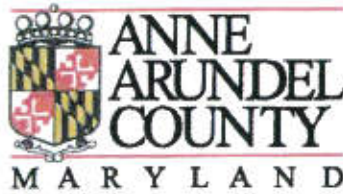

OUR "KEEP BUILDING" HISTORY

THIS IS OUR "KEEP BUILDING" STORY



Today's celebration would not be possible without the sharp eyes of Tyia Graves. One year ago, the youth Sunday School class was taking a walking tour around the church. It was Tyia who noticed the cornerstone at the front of the church indicating that Sunday morning was the church's 129th anniversary. Her discovery set the wheels in motion for our 130th Anniversary & Homecoming Celebration.

The cornerstone indicated that the church was founded on Nov. 6, 1887. That matches the written history, which tells us that on Oct. 22, 1887 the available deed shows the first parcel of land was deeded to the trustees of St. Matthews Methodist Episcopal Church. The deed states that Bro. John T. Gross, Bro. Joseph Matthews, Bro. William (Bill) Nick, Bro. James Boyd, and Bro. Edward Dennis were trustees. The land was purchased from James and Mary Jane Thompson. Other records indicate that the original property was owned by John and Rachael Brown Nick.

This was the second Methodist church that was founded in Southern Anne Arundel County by James Thompson. The other was Franklin Methodist Episcopal Church in Churchton. Thompson was a freedman before the conclusion of the Civil War. The land that St. Matthews is located on was purchased by Thompson from the Weems family and was once part of the Thompson's farm. Records show St. Matthews was originally called Great Swamp Methodist Episcopal Church.

The formation of this church was necessary because of the increased population in the Shady Side community, in those days called "the Great Swamp." This new congregation separated from Franklin Methodist Episcopal Church, thus Franklin was known as the "mother church." According to the cornerstone, the church was dedicated on Nov. 6, 1887. The Rev. Julius Love was the first pastor of St. Matthews Methodist Episcopal Church, serving from 1887 to 1889.

Over the next 10 years, several parcels of land were purchased by the West River Circuit -- Franklin Chapel, St. Matthews and Friendship Church (Carters). The land was used to build the church and a parsonage. The church was small, 29' x 49', but it didn't take long for plans to "Keep Building."

During the pastorate of Rev. T.P. Thomas (1915-1921) and Rev. Ely Lofton (1921-1922) plans were being made to build another church. It was noted that on Nov. 29, 1922, a mortgage with Farmer's National Bank was recorded in the sum of \$2,500 with St. Matthews Methodist Episcopal Church. Rev. J.L. Brown (1922-1923) was pastor when the cornerstone of the church was laid in 1922. This building consisted only of a sanctuary. The church was an A-frame building with a bell tower.

In 1943, under the leadership of Rev. A.T. Middleton (1938-1952) and dedicated members, the mortgage that was recorded in 1922 was paid off. On Palm Sunday, St. Matthews celebrated the burning of the mortgage.

In the late 1940s, with God's continuous blessings, the church borrowed \$5,000 to help build a new parsonage. Rev. Middleton moved to the Franklin Hall until completion of the construction. The parsonage was owned by Franklin and St. Matthews churches.

With Rev. Walter H. Sewell (1957-1973) at the helm, there were many improvements and accomplishments. Sis. Dorothea Dennis, with great commitment and concern, was led by the Spirit to be a booster for improvements. She knew that for the church to grow spiritually and in attendance, much had to be accomplished.

Major improvements to the church were made between 1959 and 1965 primarily by Bro. Leonard Nick with the help of Bro. George Crowner and Bro. Varnell Nick. The improvements included: replacing the coal stove with an oil furnace; tiling the dining room, living room, and the hall of the parsonage; the addition of an educational room, hall, restroom, and furnace room. In 1965, the church was bricked, and a cable was placed through the middle of the church to support the frame. Yes, the church kept building.

In 1968, the Methodist Church and the Evangelical United Brethren Church became the United Methodist Church. St. Matthews Episcopal Methodist Church, under the leadership of Rev. Walter H. Sewell (1957-1973), became St. Matthews United Methodist Church of the Baltimore Annual Conference. At that time, the order of worship changed, and the hymn book changed. St. Matthews United Methodist Church was on the Churchton charge, which consisted of Franklin and St. Matthews churches.

In 1984, after nearly 100 years of building, growing, changes and improvements, the church needed to renovate. Total membership was 130 with potential growth of 50. The church assessed its needs:

1. A sanctuary that seats 170, in addition to 30 choir seats.
2. Adequate space for entering and exiting, meeting the fire regulation requirements
3. Bathroom facilities
4. Multipurpose area that seats 200
5. Office space for equipment necessary for filing, printing, collating, typing, etc.
6. A study for the pastor, adequate for counseling and other ministerial duties in a professional setting.
7. Adequate space for the use and storage of equipment as well as personal belongings for choir members, ushers and communion stewards during service.

One of the challenges was not having enough land for renovations and additions to fulfill the church's needs. The Administrative Board members, with Bro. Arthelbert Holland as

Renovation Committee chairperson, decided that we would pursue the question of purchasing the parcel of open field that lies between St. Matthews and Centenary United Methodist Church. After several meetings and the hiring of a surveyor, we were told that the land was once owned by John Nick, but was later purchased in tax sale by Benjamin Michelson. The land was deeded to Centenary in 1937.

It wasn't until 1986, with the commitment and determination that the Renovation Committee chairperson, Bro. Johnnie Washington and Rev. Eddie Smith, pastor (1983-1989), arranged for a joint trustee meeting with Centenary UMC. As a result of the sharing of key information concerning the property, St. Matthews was given a portion of the land that was needed to renovate.

On Sunday, Nov. 27, 1988, a drawing of the perspective building was presented to the congregation.

Rev. George A. Stansbury (1989-1995) became the pastor in July 1989. He was well aware of our needs and was eager for the church to continue to be good stewards with God's blessings.

In 1991, after interviewing architects and builders, preliminary drawings were done by Lee Warner Architects, Inc. The presentation was made to the Conference Building and Locations Committee. We thought we were well on our way to construction but faced yet another challenge. We were told we did not have sufficient land for construction. The trustees went back again to our neighboring church to ask for more land. Centenary UMC was gracious again and promised us the land for construction.

Our newly assigned Renovation Committee chairperson, Bro. Victor Smith Sr, was installed in 1992. On Nov. 8, 1992, Bro. Smith presented plans to the congregation. We were again involved in the largest renovation project in 105 years of our original structure. The last parcel of land was kindly given to us by Centenary UMC. The deed was officially recorded. Renovation plans went into effect and an architect was hired. The congregation was committed and dedicated to the goal of building a new church.

On July 10, 1993, the church held a groundbreaking ceremony for our renovation project. The ground breakers were:

- Rev. George A. Stansbury, Pastor
- Bro. Victor Smith Sr., Chairperson of Renovation
- Rev. Johnnie Washington, former chairperson
- Bro. Arthelbert Holland, former chairperson
- Bro. Kendal Gross, Trustee
- Sis. Teresa Fountain, United Methodist Women
- Bro. Frank Hopkins, United Methodist Men
- Sis. Sarah Matthews, oldest member of the church
- Tamara Smith, Youth
- Justin Holland, Children
- Sis. Laura Salisbury, Church School Superintendent
- Bro. John Fountain, chairperson of the PPR

In 1995, St. Matthews welcomed Rev. Roberta C. Matthews (1995-2004, 2014-2016), the first female pastor in the 108-year history of the church. Under the leadership of Rev. Matthews, it was with great commitment and determination that the Renovation Committee and the entire congregation continued to work toward the goal – a new church.

In 1996, the Finance Committee launched the Capital Building Fund Campaign with Sis. Teresa Fountain as the chairperson of the committee. The church was involved in a prayerful financial stewardship program to continue with Phase 1 plans, which included building the education and fellowship wing, pastor's study, and a financial secretary's office.

In a workshop from Aug. 17 to Sept. 8, 1996, we received vital spiritual preparation as we shared in the meaning and spirit of our building fund. Commitment cards were prepared to help each member decide. On Sept. 12, 1996, everyone was invited to the church to share experiences, hear the total commitments, and celebrate the achievement. On that day the church received commitments of nearly \$220,000.

The church made the decision to combine Phase I, Part I & II. In December 1996, commitment cards were presented for a special moment of prayer and dedication. A special time was set aside each Sunday during our regular worship service to pray for renovation.

In June 1997, the trustees and officials of the administrative board signed the mortgage papers for a loan from the United Methodist development fund. The plans were:

Phase I, Part I, to construct:

- Church entrance vestibule;
- Secretary's office of pastor study;
- Coat closet and rest rooms;
- Kitchen with equipment and mechanical room.

While this work was ongoing, we submitted a lot coverage variance to the county to continue with the construction of Phase I, Part II:

- The multipurpose building in classrooms;
- The installation of a 26,000-gallon water storage tank;
- And a storm water management facility.

Individual pledges and donations, along with many special programs and activities, continued as we built on our finances with God's blessing.

On Feb. 2, 1998, renovation of Phase I began. Members enjoyed a renovation celebration on that Sunday.

In October 1998, St. Matthews Phase I project was completed. A "Consecration Celebration" was held on Nov. 21, 1998.

On May 27, 2001, we became involved in revising our Financial Stewardship Campaign to quickly pay off our prior loan to prepare the way for our new sanctuary in Phase II.

Informative time began the discussion to better understand our financial commitments. The commitments required extra giving beyond our regular weekly tithes and offerings. A play written by Rev. Matthews entitled, *"What's That You Said Lord?"* was presented to benefit our renovation fund.

Over the next nine years, members of the church dedicated themselves to providing the finances needed to "Keep Building." But the building was not *only* about constructing the new sanctuary. Annual Family Days, started in 1976 by Rev. Richard T. Herbert (1973-1983), Sis. Helen Gorham and Sis. Christolynne Scott, continued to grow and prosper as the dedicated families of the church continued to display their talents. Ministries were growing, choirs were birthed, servants of the church were honored on a yearly basis. Black History Month celebrations were vibrant, and the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr Annual Breakfast was launched.

The church certainly did "Keep Building." "During her tenure (2006-2014), Rev. Anne Parker's leadership of St. Matthews was key to continuing to the spiritual growth of the church and the physical building of the new church sanctuary. Phase II continued with the construction of the multipurpose building and classrooms with builder Taurus Enterprises, Inc. The church continued its Financial Stewardship Campaign through this building process solely for the support of construction, which God blessed financially and spiritually allowing the church to pay off two mortgages for the first phase for this project early.

But there was still one more Phase that needed to be completed. The church had to "Keep Building." After all permits were approved for the construction of the new church sanctuary, a meeting was held on Feb. 4, 2009, with the Rev. Theresa A. Robinson (2006-2014), members from the Renovation Committee, Finance Committee and the Stewardship Committee to discuss finalizing our loan application to Sandy Spring Bank for the construction of the new sanctuary. Our Stewardship Committee asked the entire congregation to re-pledge again for our continued stewardship campaign. Renewal of all pledges was a key factor before we finalized our loan and commitment to a mortgage payment. God had blessed us beyond measure and we looked forward to his guidance and direction as we had endeavored to complete this project to build his Kingdom. "Not my will Lord, but Thy will be done."

On April 17, 2011, groundbreaking service for the new sanctuary was held with Rev. Robinson as the presiding pastor. A meeting was last held on Tuesday June 26 with members from the Renovation Ministries Committee, Finance Ministries Committee and the Stewardship Committee in attendance. At this meeting we introduced Dave Ward of Taurus Enterprises, the General Contractor who would be the builder on our project. Taurus Enterprises was the company that built the first part of project and we are glad to have them back to finish the new sanctuary.



The deed for the loan for the construction of the new church was signed on April 21, 2011. Signees were, Trustee Chairman, Bro. Herb Matthews, Trustee Vice Chairman, Bro. Kendal

Gross, and Evelyn Darden, the Attorney representing the church. Also in attendance were Sis. Carmelia Hicks, Bro. Ron Holland Sr. and Bro. Victor Smith Sr.

The prayers continued as did the giving of the congregation. Trusting in the Lord throughout this process, St. Matthews UMC held its first service in the new sanctuary on Sunday, Feb. 12, 2012.

The final phase of the building process took form in October 2016, under the leadership of Rev. Marvin R. Wamble (2016 to present), the 32nd pastor of St. Matthews, when the parking lot was paved and painted. With every phase completed, the building continues. New ideas for ministries and community outreach are springing forward. The congregation continues to serve and give, taking hold of its new vision - "Engaging, Impacting and Transforming."

Maybe years from today another youth, like Tyia, will read a cornerstone and seek to know more about the historical journey of St. Matthews United Methodist Church and understand its drive to "Keep Building."

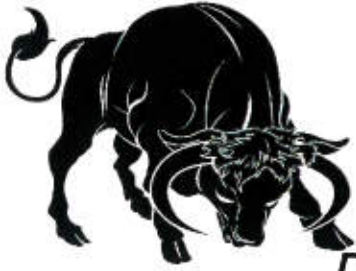
