

## How the Month of July Got Its Name

July is named for a mortal. Julius Caesar was a Roman general, statesman, who changed the structure of the Roman government into a dictatorship, was assassinated in legendary fashion, and most importantly for our purposes, helped make the calendar what it is today.

July was named in honor of Julius Caesar. When Julius Caesar died, *Quintilis*, which was his birth month, was renamed with July. *Quintilis* means "fifth month" in Latin, which represents where this month originally fell in the Roman calendar.
