

on the ship, at the IALOH Convention next year. Nobles and Ladies, you don't want to miss this! Also, begin getting your teams ready for competition. We would like to have, at least, all the teams from Texas in competition along with all the others who will be coming.

What I want to spend some space on is: "What does IALOH do for my unit?" On occasion, someone will ask this question and, in my opinion, there are many things IALOH does, but has never been put in print. I will put them in numerical order, but not necessarily in order of importance.

- The Insignia or Medallion was registered with the U. S. Patent Office and received the Patent on August 19, 1978. This was to protect the emblem and to make it available to all member units as a "recognizable emblem" for all LOH units in the USA, and now internationally. This protection assures all LOH units that the manufacturers of the emblem have been vetted and that the production is in accordance with the correct dimensions and colors. These manufacturers pay an annual fee to IALOH. This includes embroidery if it is to be done on a large scale and made to sell. This is under the control of the Finance Officer, Pete Phillips.
- 2. For 34 years, IALOH has provided for all LOH units and guests to attend the Arlington Wreath Laying Ceremony. The Necrology Service is held Saturday morning before we go to the Cemetery. Usually, a combined Color Guard from the Washington, D. C. area and members of the Army's Fife and Drum Corps participate. The price has always been kept to a minimum so it is affordable to everyone. It is a great way to meet new people and to meet old friends during the three day event.
- 3. IALOH also provides a yearly National Convention. It is held in different cities each year and is another opportunity to visit with old friends and to make new friends. At this convention, it is an opportunity for your team to compete and take home another trophy.
- 4. IALOH maintains a website. Your units and regional associations are encouraged to send in officer's names and events to be posted for everyone to see. We have had links to Temple LOH unit's websites, but they have sadly fallen by the way-side. It is also difficult to get the Temple Associations LOH units to provide their officer's names and the dates of their meetings. The website is a treasure trove of information, but it hasn't been kept current and we are working to fix that and to make it more relevant to the individual members and LOH units. This includes having a Quartermaster page with pictures of all items we have for sale and a way to pay with a credit card. We are looking at more ways to make it even more relevant.
- 5. The Commander and the Lt. Commanders are always ready to attend your functions, if invited, to show support for your unit. We need to know well in advance to know who can be there and to get it in our schedule. We welcome the opportunity to install your officers and to meet with your Divans. Sharing information is also one way to help each other in recruiting new members.
- 6. The dues are kept low for a reason. We want all LOH units to be members. The \$2.00 is for each and every member whether active or honorary with the exception of the Potentate who is a member of every unit the year he is Potentate. As you know the minimum is \$30.00 and I know of one unit where there was only one member for several years and he paid the \$30.00. It took time and a lot of work, but they now have about 25 members.
- 7. The IALOH prints a Newsletter four times a year to keep you informed. It is sent to the Adjutant of each member unit without charge. Any member may have it sent to his home with a \$10.00 subscription fee. It's rare we get an article from a LOH unit or LOH Association, but your articles would be a welcome addition. These are just seven things that IALOH does for you. The question I like to ask is what does your local LOH Association do for you? What does your Temple do for you? I have found that the organizations, in themselves, do not do anything for you. They provide opportunities for you to participate in and enjoy. It was told to me once that you only get out of the organization what you put in. So if you want to participate and have fun, you have to go to the events provided whether it is your Temple, Association, or IALOH.

Annual Report Data

Dear Nobles,

The forms for the 2017 Data Call were sent along with copies of the 2017-2018 Yearbook ad forms. The most important form is the 2017 Annual Report. This form serves as a reminder about your Unit's annual Association dues and also provides us with contact information for your Unit as well as the names, addresses, phone numbers, and e-mail addresses of your 2017 officers.

The Annual Convention is in April again next year, so the Delegate Nominations form and the Necrology Report need to be returned by 01 March 2017. For your convenience, all the forms can be returned to me at the same time. As an additional option, these Annual data call forms are available through the IALOH web site at <u>www.ialoh.org</u>. The forms can be filled in on-line and then printed for submission. Unfortunately there is not yet a way to submit the forms electronically.

Your Unit's Association dues remain \$2.00 per Unit member as of 31 December of the preceding year (which is 31 Dec 2016 for 2017 dues) and the only exceptions to the aforementioned dues will be those members holding <u>Honorary Memberships</u> within a unit. Remember, for those units with 15 or fewer members, there is a dues minimum of \$30.00. This minimum was set to just cover the expenses of the yearbook and newsletters.

Additional guidance on the remaining forms:

Delegate Nominations - All voting members from each Unit at the Annual Convention in O'Fallon, IL, must be registered and each member's name should only be entered in one category.

Necrology Report - This report is used for the Memorial Service and to update Association records.

Yearbook Ad forms – You may notice that we have been able to maintain last year's price for the yearbook ads. Please make copies of these forms and make them available to your membership. A yearbook ad is a great way for your Unit and your members to show their support for the entire Legion of Honor. You could also remind them that every advertiser gets a copy of the yearbook. Thanks to you all for your continued help and support!
