Pastor's Corner

Part of me is surprised that summer's end is on the horizon. August brings an inevitable feeling for me: "There was more I wanted to enjoy this summer, AND there is more to prepare for in September!" A tug between longing in the now and preparedness for the immediate future. Both are good. Our two boards (Session & Deacons) will be joining for our annual ("big picture") meeting on the 8th, so *please be praying for that time*, that we are *open to the Spirit* and *to each other*, and that we have the *wisdom to discern* where God wants to take us, the *courage to follow*, and the *vision to lead* the rest of the congregation – please be praying for all the members of Puckety's family to that end as well. One special way to 'put legs' on such prayer is to come to the mini-Ministry Fair (during the coffee hour on Sun. Aug. 13th at Faith Hall after worship). We can't encourage you strongly enough to take advantage of that time – not just to understand the various ministries of Puckety, but to explore the ways you could fit in!

Each one of us should be asking ourselves (on a monthly basis) how am I helping to live out the mission Christ has given Puckety to: *honor God*, *grow in faith*, and *improve our community and world*. It's one thing to say it or memorize it, but how, specifically, have you determined to be God's heart, voice and hands, making a lasting difference in the lives of others around us. My memories of Israel are already starting to slowly fade in their sharpness – thank the Lord for pictures and journaling. Let me try to shine one up a bit by sharing it with you. At the end of the newsletter you'll find a devotion referencing the loving Fatherhood of God toward us. Well, that wonderful quality of God was made poignantly clear when we visited the *Pater Noster* Church on the Mount of Olives in Jerusalem – built to commemorate the time Jesus taught his disciples in answer to their request, "Teach us to pray." To which he gave them what we call the Lord's Prayer, beginning with the words "Our Father" which, in Aramaic, is *Pater Noster*.

At the church, nearly everywhere you look, you will find a version of the prayer in a different language – along the walls, cloisters, hallways, arches and ceilings, all used to display plaques in 140 different languages and dialects. But the primary place is given to the version in the language it was originally given – *Aramaic*. This makes sense since that's how Jesus first delivered it, but there's *another* reason. Many Christians are encouraged by the closeness conveyed by the beginning of the prayer, "*Our Father*." But Jesus' disciples would have been *surprised* at the very start … not just because of the nearness implied by the words, but because of the language he used - he was giving it in Aramaic (the common tongue of the Jews at the time), instead of the more formal Hebrew, in which all the "proper" prayers to God were given as instructed by the rabbis. Why is this important? Jesus was communicating the "translatability" of God's love and purpose. Long before there were different translations of the Scriptures, Jesus (the divine Word of God translated into human flesh) was revealing powerfully how what God was doing is for all … and how his word is translatable into all languages, in order to reach all people. Jesus was making a statement. And the *Pater Noster* Church does a beautiful job (literally and figuratively) of illustrating that. *Pastor Brian*





A Devotional For You A Center for the Soul (read Psalm 42 & Romans 8:12-17)

Recently I finished preaching a series on the Psalms, and now we have been looking at the middle chapters in Romans. And I found a connection between the two in the writing of John Ortberg, in the idea of God's fatherly care of us. The Psalmist cries out, *"Why are you downcast, O my soul? Why are you disturbed within me?"* (Ps. 42:5) Another translation puts it this way: *"How collapsed you are my soul, and how you sigh over me."* Pastor Ortberg writes in his book, *Soul Keeping, "A soul without a center is like a house built over a sinkhole ... On the other hand, the soul comes alive when it is centered on God. <i>'Let the morning bring me word of Your unfailing love... for to You I lift up my soul.'"*

A certain man tells of how his 3-year-old son used to approach him when he was tired or frightened or just needed to be held. The little guy would reach out with his arms and say, "Hodja, Daddy. Hodja" – his 3-year-old version of "Hold me, Daddy." Years later, his son, now a grown man in his thirties, came home from work and discovered his wife had left him for another man. He was devastated and called his dad and asked if he could come over. Of course he could, so he drove the five hours to his parents' home, walked in the door, and collapsed into his father's arms. The father later said, "I could almost hear him crying, 'Hodja, Daddy. Hodja.""

The Apostle Paul, of course, conveys something similar in Rom. 8, because through our adoption, we now not only pray to God as "O Holy One, transcendent God above all," but as co-heirs with Christ, we cry, "Abba Father" – the same intimate title Jesus himself used for the Father – close to our word, *Daddy*. This changes everything. When we reach out to God, we are lifting our souls up to be nurtured and healed. A soul centered in God always knows it has a heavenly Father who will hold its pain, its fear, its anxiety. Ortberg lays it out for us, "*This is spiritual life: To place the soul each moment in the presence and care of God*." The Psalmist proclaims the need to do just that: "*My soul clings to You; Your right hand upholds me*."

It is much harder than it sounds to keep our souls centered on God. We hold on tightly, but often to the wrong things. But staying centered on God – His Word, His ways – is the essence of life for the soul. Thomas Kelly wrote, "We feel honestly the pull of many obligations and try to fulfill them all. We are unhappy, uneasy, strained, oppressed, and fearful that we shall be shallow. We have hints that there is a way of life vastly richer and deeper than all this hurried existence, a life of unhurried serenity and peace and power. If only we could slip over into that Center! We have seen and known some people who have found this deep Center of living …"

"My soul clings to You; Your right hand upholds me." When God seems distant, "My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When can I go and meet with God?" (Ps. 42:2). Brother Lawrence called this: "Practicing the presence of God," and the most important part of that practice lay in "renouncing, once and for all, whatever does not lead to God."

Ortberg suggests that a very simple way to guard your soul is to ask yourself, "*Will this situation block my soul's connection to God?*" As we begin living this question, we find how little power the world has over our soul. "What if I don't get a promotion, or my boss doesn't like me, or I have financial problems, or the medical tests have bad results?" Yes, these may cause disappointment, but do they have any power over my soul? Can they nudge my soul from its center, which is the very heart of God? When you think about it that way, you realize that *external circumstances cannot keep you from being with God. If anything, they draw you closer to Him.* One crying out, "Hold me, Abba Father!"

Your Outreach Team thanks those of you who have been participating in our effort to "improve our community and world". We continue to search for and develop new and better ways to serve our mission of spreading the Good News as the Body of Christ! Please visit our table at the upcoming Ministry Fair on August 13th. Some of you have helped or soon will be helping the TryLife Center by working in teams for 2-3 hours one day this year to inspect, clean, and/or organize clothing and other supplies. Once a month, we have

committed to providing this service to this wonderful organization who helps young mothers with pregnancy, parenting and life skills support. There is no limit to how many of us can participate each time, so you might still sign up on the bulletin board to work with others from Puckety who have already committed. It's a fun time for fellowship and sharing your faith. TryLife has another need that would require greater time and dedication than our current ministry effort with them. You will hear more about this table at the upcoming Ministry Fair on August 13th.

We are making some changes to our ministry approach to the schools. We are discontinuing the recognition of the school staff with cards, snacks, water, and gift coupons. Research is underway to find more useful ways to show them our appreciation for what they do. You will be informed before the end of the year what we will provide to them early in 2024. Finally, here is a report from our global partner, David Lian, the founder and president of the Myanmar Undergraduate School of Theology (MUST):

A Brief Myanmar Mission Report (from Rev. David Ngun Peng Lian) July 20, 2023

Warmest greetings to you from Myanmar! It has been a great blessing to get to know Puckety Church. We have been so blessed to partner with you all in the Lord's ministries for the past many years. Your support and prayers have meant a lot to our ministries. (pic0)

- 1. The children at Agape House are doing well in the Lord (pic1). [Most of these kids come from homes that were burned down by the military gov't. They took them to a swimming pool, owned by a wealthy Buddhist businessman who gave MUST a discount! (pic2)]. Thanks for sending your support a few weeks ago. We have used some of your support for buying rice bags (pic3) and some of it for our building project. The children enjoy their schooling. Now, no one is sick though some suffered from flu two weeks ago. All 46 children here are doing well, studying well, eating well, clothed well, and taken care of well through your prayers and support.
- 2. We have admitted 39 students (pic4) this year after closing MUST for three years because of political situation in Myanmar. Now, we have begun to admit only first year students. We praise the Lord for sending us these committed young people to MUST. Everything is going well in the Lord. All students enjoy their studies, time, and stay.

- 3. Our three daughter churches are doing well, too. Now, every church member comes back to attend our churches because things get better, though big gatherings are still prohibited.
- 4. Our construction for the orphans is going well, too (pics5-8). We hope to finish it in two weeks. Now, the first floor and second floor are already occupied by the children, though it is still under construction because of our accommodation problem. We praise the Lord for friends who donated to this project - including you. We still need your prayers to finish our building project.

Thanks again for your love, prayers and support for MUST ministries. Much love in the Lord, David
