

The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings w/your children

Here at our parish, we are transitioning away from Children's Liturgy of the Word during the Mass, and instead, we would like to encourage parents to discuss the weekly readings or homily with their children either before or after Mass occurs. This spiritual conversation, even if it is simple or a bit scattered, can be very powerful, and it is a way for God's word to come alive in our hearts. We will provide questions and discussion points to help parents start this conversation with their children, and please consider doing this with your family each week!

Welcome to a new church season. We are in Ordinary Time and Father Ben will be wearing green for a short time. Another way to think about Ordinary Time is we are counting time. It is a time to listen to the Word of God, and grow into better disciples.

What does it mean to be a servant?

We have beautiful examples of those who serve God. In our readings today, we hear about the prophet Isaiah, St. Paul and St. John the Baptist who all lived their lives as God asked them to. Isaiah says he is a servant of God who was formed in his mother's womb. He says they are called to do a specific task, even thought they may not know it right away.

St. John spoke about Jesus as one who ranked ahead of him. John recognized that Jesus was greater than him. On their own, these servants would not be able to do great work. But because God made them holy, these people would be able to do the work that belongs to God.

John was clear on what his work was as a servant of God. He served God so that Jesus might be known. John understood that Jesus was truly the Lamb of God who would take away the sins of the world. John saw the Holy Spirit come down on Jesus and God say, "This is my beloved Son". This was so important that John had to tell everyone about Jesus.

In the psalm today, we sang, "Here I am Lord, I come to do your will". We are telling God that we are here to do his work, to be his servant.


