Dreams...according to Webster's Dictionary: a dream is a series of thoughts, images, or emotions occurring during sleep. Are you a dreaming person?

The Magi dreamt of a dangerous king who does not look favorably upon the baby the Magi have found.

These dreams bring us through the Advent Season as we prepare our hearts to witness a most wondrous birth in the City of Bethlehem.



The event had a wonderful turnout from the communities of Leesport, Ontelaunee, Fleetwood and Hamburg.

We interacted with close to 80 youth who participated in a bean bag toss with their choice of prize of a squishable toy or slime.

In addition, we had bookmarks for anyone to take that could be colored as well as candy, note pads and stickers.

This was a great community event to be a part of and we look forward to taking part again in 2025!



LCHT MINISTRIES

FOOD PANTRY:

Our church is the distribution site for the Schuylkill Valley Food Pantry. It is a monthly distribution done on the third Saturday of each month, from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. There is an income guideline and a registration form to fill out, giving us your name and address as well as the number of family members in your household. Also, there are brochures and information available on heating assistance, ways to conserve energy and general

concerns of limited income families. Please call 717-673-8789 for further information. Distribution continues as a drive through service. Pre packaged boxes come from Helping Harvest.

We also pack other donated items into boxes to supplement the Helping Harvest box.

Thanks to the generosity of LCHT, the food pantry has been able to remake the former Boy Scout section of the ground level into a working space for the S.V. Food Pantry. New electric outlets were installed. New freezers and a refrigerator were purchased to support the safe storage of food items until distribution date. All expenses were paid for by the Food Pantry.

The closet and other storage area previously used by the Food Pantry were emptied and made available for use by LCHT.

We continue to have the opportunity to pick up food items weekly from Sheetz in Leesport, and from WaWa in Hamburg. We could use one or two additional people who might be able to substitute for the pickup when the weekly volunteers are unavailable.

Distribution of food continues each month on the third Saturday of the month. Distribution is supported by individual churches, each taking two specific months of the year.

We are fortunate that schools, businesses, senior citizen groups and other organizations continue to support the pantry with collections of food items.

Helping Harvest continues to support the pantry, however we have seen changes in the items available for distribution, and sometimes in the amounts available.

The SV Food Pantry is grateful for the support of LCHT, as well as the support of all the churches in the Leesport area.

WELCA

WELCA meets the first Monday of the month at 1:00. Pastor Fran will hold a bible study. All are invited to attend. Our next two meetings are November 4 and December 2. We hope to see you there! WELCA continues to collect REDNER REGISTER TAPES. Remember to use your "save-a-tape" card. In order for Redner's to count the receipt (a.k.a. - register tape), it has to be the **ENTIRE** receipt, and it has to have a "save-a-tape" number on it. Use your pump perks card or save-a-tape card at the checkout. Then, just drop the ENTIRE receipt in the box at the ushers station in the narthex. DO NOT CUT the bottom off.

We only get credit for COMPLETE tapes! Redner's Markets gives 1% of purchases back to the Women of the ELCA. This one percent can really add up. Your help is so appreciated. If you have any questions, please see Janet Kleffel, or call her at 610-926-2083 if you need your tapes picked up.

THANKING everyone who supports our worthwhile program in helping others through the Redner's Tape program.

Veterans Making a Difference is an ongoing project through WELCA and Pastoral Care. There is a box in the narthex for collecting needed items for the veterans. Items will be delivered as they accumulate. Suggestions for items are as follows: Toothpaste (preferably Crest), toothbrushes, mouthwash, deodorant (preferably Old Spice), shampoo, sleep pants (L, XL, XXL), toilet paper, paper towels, laundry detergent, liquid body soap and dish soa
