REACH of Cherokee and Graham County, Inc. is an outreach program for victims of domestic violence.

As the staff travel to the schools to discuss domestic violence, they have identified a need for children's shoes, underwear, and socks of varying sizes. They have also adopted some families to help as well. **Teens frequently request a fleece blanket.** If you have items of clothing (clean and in good condition), children's books, etc. to donate please place them in the blue bin located in the pantry. Check out the clearance section at Walmart next time you go shopping.

Stacy can always use some **small tote bags** and small travel size items to fill them with, e.g. travel size shampoo and conditioner, toothbrushes, tooth paste, travel size deodorant, hand sanitizer, etc.

Please contact the REACH office staff if you have furniture you want to donate to arrange pickup by the Thrift Store volunteers. They also ask for cooking utensils to help victims start over. So, if you have something you no longer want, they could use it. Often the victims leave home with only the clothes on their back, so they are given clothes, furniture, and items for the home from the Thrift Store until they can get back on their feet. They also can use items to help with their self-esteem and pass the time until they can be placed in a safe environment. You can provide puzzles (500 pieces or less), adult coloring books, reading

material, word puzzles, make-up, nail polish, hair clips, etc.

Volunteers and donors are always needed. Call the office at 828-837-2097 or 828-837-8064 for more information. Local REACH covers Cherokee and Graham County.

A Night in Bethlehem 2023

This is the time when local churches and local organizations outreach to the community to celebrate the birth of Christ and let them know what services are available. The fairground on the West end of US 64 will be set up to resemble the marketplace at the time of Christ's birth. Each church and organization that volunteers agrees to bring food and crafts for the children especially. **Please remain a few minutes after morning worship on November 26th, the Sunday after Thanksgiving,** to hear from Roy and Sheri Goodlet the details of what has been planned and any special requests to help make this year a success. **If you stay you may want to bring your own lunch.**

On November 28th volunteers are needed to meet at 6 pm at the Mountain Folk Center west of Murphy for a quick clean-up of the facility to prepare for use for the 'Night in Bethlehem. At 7 pm there will be a last quick meeting for instructions and prayer time.

There are twenty-seven churches committed at this time. We are hoping for over 1,000 people this year on December 9th. **The organizers of a Night in Bethlehem will have a float in Murphy Christmas parade on December 2nd. Volunteers are needed to ride the float or walk the parade**

route handing out invitations to people in attendance.

Murphy Church of Christ members volunteered to bring cookies, it should be noted the chocolate chips were the most popular so you might want to keep that in mind when donating cookies (make sure you divide the cookies into small baggies). If cookies have nuts in them, please make a note on the outside of the baggies.

Thanks to your generosity we have 156 books to give away. If you want to help with crafts, please let DJ know.

The activities will be held December 9th from 5 – 8 pm. All volunteers are asked to dress in period clothing, but it is not a requirement. Your support by your presence is most important!

December 25th



Christmas lights are lights often used for decoration in celebration of Christmas, often on display throughout the Christmas season. The custom goes back to when Christmas trees were decorated with candles, which symbolized Christ being the light of the world. The Christmas trees were brought by Christians into their homes in early modern Germany.
