Tidings from Timothy

All of us exert an influence. Some obviously more than others, but nonetheless we all impact those that we meet. I would like to springboard off the idea of father's day to talk about the influence we weld on others and how it can determine your salvation and the salvation of your neighbor. Have you ever heard the expression, "the apple does not fall far from the tree"? This saying does not always have to be true but more often than not it is true. Why? Because the influence of home and your peers is so powerful. See how this has both helped and hurt people down through history as we look to some Bible examples today.

Also, I wish to continue our stories this Sunday night with one of my favorite old testament characters: Gideon. This man was a great guy, but he could not believe his own eyes. Find out all about him Sunday night.

The Hatton Half: The Gospel in John 3:16 (Part 2)

Let us consider the last half of John 3:16, namely “that whosoever believeth in him should not perish” first. Let us notice the term that God has applied for belief. God did not just select a certain few to possess the ability to believe. It is those who hold to Calvinism that suggest people have already been chosen for salvation and nothing can be done to change that. God does not look at the face of a man to determine his worth (Rom. 2:11; Acts 10:34-35). Anyone can believe on the Lord. Though belief is important to reaching a state of salvation, it is not the only step. If belief was the only thing necessary, the devils would be saved as well (Jam. 2:19). Belief is only a means to an end, if you will. All who do these things should not perish. This does not necessarily mean that all who do these things will not perish. There will be some who decide to depart from the faith (1 Tim. 4:1-3). Some in the Galatian church were seduced by some false teaching (Gal. 1:6-9). It is inevitable that a situation like this arises. If someone does, that person’s situation will be much worse that had they not known the truth (2 Pet. 2:20-22). There was one preacher quoted as saying that he would rather not know the truth, than know it and decide to leave it. Of course, he did not want to be in that situation anyway, but that is the way he would prefer.

Finally, let us analyze “but have everlasting life.” The life promised is an everlasting one. The word in the original by definition does not demonstrate that end. When we reach that home beyond the sky, as one hymn suggests, we will be there for good. Paul made it very clear that once we are there, we are there (1 The. 4:17). If it ever came to an end, I would suggest that as a very disheartening state of affairs. However, we can have confidence in knowing that the life for which we strive is eternal. The gospel in John 3:16 is truly amazing and one that needs to be considered much more. If we keep the faith and do not lose heart, we can have hope that the eternal home promised will be ours.
