

"Our Need for Grace in the New Year"

"So he got up and came to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion for him, and ran and embraced him and kissed him." Luke 15:20

We recently completed a series of messages on the parables of Jesus. One of the most famous of the parables is "The Parable of the Prodigal Son." I omitted that in the series because I had preached on it within the last seven or eight years. The message of that parable, however, is always needed. We need repentance, and we need grace.

We live in a human society that is so often oriented toward works and rewards. Part of human society is built upon earning our way through life. In school we get grades that are based upon our academic accomplishments. In work we are paid at least partly on the basis of our contributions. In human interactions we are rewarded at least partly on our responses toward others. All religions except one indicate that our status in eternity is based upon our accomplishments in this life.

The Bible also does have an element of works and rewards. The Old Testament teaches about the law of God and the consequences of disobedience. Even in the New Testament we find the principle "for whatever a man sows, this he will also reap." (Galatians 6:7) But the heart of the gospel involves grace. Paul writes, "For by grace are you saved through faith, and that not of yourselves, it is a gift of God, not as a result of works, that no one should boast." (Ephesians 2:9-10)

Jesus taught about the nature of God's grace in "The Parable of the Prodigal Son." A missionary in Lebanon once presented this parable to people in a village who had never heard the story. Their Middle Eastern culture was similar to that of Judea in the first century. The missionary asked the villagers what stood out to them about the story.

There were two things. First, in claiming the inheritance early, the younger son was saying to his father, "I wish you were dead!" It was hard for these villagers to understand how a father could tolerate such an insult and agree to the demand of such a son.

Second, they noticed that in the story the father ran to greet his prodigal son. In the Middle East a man of stature walks with a slow, deliberate gait. He never runs. In Jesus' story the father runs to meet his wayward son. Such love and grace is hard to imagine. Such is the nature of the gracious God we serve. Such is the kind of grace which we need to display in this new year. (Yancey, What's So Amazing about Grace, p. 80)
