Biography

After an inspiring and courageous journey of 38 days on a roller coaster ride of COVID related issues, David Paul Schramski gained his angel wings and went to heaven on January 13th, 2021 at McLaren Bay Region Hospital in Bay City with his family at his side. Dave was born on August 2nd, 1957 to the late John and Helen (Rybak) Schramski in Bad Axe. He was 1 of 8 kids to John and Helen and was raised on the family farm in Kinde, MI where his parents taught him about hard work and dedication, which he carried on for his life and passed onto his kids. Dave graduated from North Huron in 1975 and went on to Michigan State where he graduated in 1977 with an Electrical Technology degree. He married the

love of his life Janice (Miller) on Valentine's Day in 1987. He and Janice were blessed with two children, Christopher and Adrienne, who like their dad are able to work hard and still put a smile on everyone's faces. Dave had many hobbies, but he made sure to share his time with his three grandkids. Each one had their own special thing they did with Grandpa: Molly shared his love of fireworks and snacks especially ice cream, Jace and Grandpa would FaceTime frequently and shared a love of arcades, Brody and Grandpa shared a love of being in the woods and riding on his four-wheeler. He was always fond of cutting firewood and doing shots with "The Brothers" and "The Nephews", as he would always call them. Family was something that Dave held dear to his heart and did his best to keep in touch with everyone. Some of his other hobbies included camping, hunting, going for long bike rides, listening to the widest variety of music, and trips to the casino. Dave was well known in the community for doing electrical work as a master electrician, which he found more fun than work; he also worked for TI Automotive in Caro for 35 years where he held many different roles, but was most recently the Facilities Manager. Every September he would help with the Kinde Polka Fest by preparing the wiring to make sure everything would run smoothly. He spent time on the parish council and building committee for Annunciation of the Lord Parish and counted the collection on Sundays. Dave was extremely hard working, and worked for everything he had in life, but was also the biggest kid you would meet. His favorite holiday was Halloween; during one of those fun and memorable October camping trips he gained the nickname "Big Kahuna" while dressed as a caveman and it has stuck ever since.
