PASTOR'S POST

I couldn't help but wonder how this soap opera, or any soap opera for that matter, would be different if it included some faith. No, the dysfunction won't disappear, but the show would have a completely different dimension.

Well, back to real life. Whatever 2020 holds (which will be far less messy than any soap opera) my prayer is that as people of faith, our faith and trust in the Lord will flourish as we live our 2020 storylines. So best wishes for this new-year and see you in worship throughout the year!



Greetings from your Parish Nurse. And Happy New Year!



As we begin this new year, I am reminded of what I have been learning in our group study of the book by Nancy DeMoss, "Choosing Gratitude". Our discussion this week was centered on the question "Do I spend more time worshipping or whining?'. It's a valid question. Do I spend more time thinking about my problems, focusing on how I have been wronged, or about what I can be thankful for? Do I wake up praising God in the morning, or do I focus immediately on the difficulties I need to overcome?

We have so many reasons to be thankful to God for the gifts He gives. It begins with the first breath we take in the morning, and our ability to take our first steps of the day. We can continue being thankful for the home we have, the food that we have available and for our families and friends. Our lives are filled with God's blessings to us.

Focusing on these blessings lifts our spirits and draws our attention to the Goodness of God each day. Focusing on our difficulties does just the opposite. It pulls us down to discouragement or despair; it turns our attention to what is wrong and fills us with frustration and disappointment in those around us. In short, it makes us miserable.

Our attitude of ingratitude also has an effect on other areas of our lives. For instance, negative emotions like anger, bitterness and stress have been shown to affect us physically through hypertension and heart disease, and gastrointestinal problems like ulcers or bowel issues. It also has an effect on the people around us. When we begin the day with a negative attitude, we often find that others ignore us or react with their own negative feelings.

So let's begin this New Year with a new resolution. A resolution to cultivate an "attitude of gratitude" by beginning each day thanking God for at least 5 blessings we recognize, and then showing gratitude to others around us by thanking them for their acts of kindness to us.

SPOTLIGHT ON THE DYSART CENTER

Shortly after United Church of Sun City was founded more than 50 years ago, Pastor Walter Witt, was instrumental in starting an outreach to migrant workers in El Mirage. Known as the Dysart Community Center, our church still supports this vibrant program which offers English as a Second Language classes, after school latchkey programming, athletic programs, tutoring, supplemental food, etc. Eligible for the Arizona "Working Poor" credit, many of our members appreciate the tax credit available for their contributions to Dysart.

One of our congregation, Pat Koopmans, or Ms. Pat as she's know to the children, loves to work with the 8-13 year old children at the Dysart Community Center. Pat often and enthusiastically dresses up as an Elf, a clown, or whatever the season/reason calls for! She teaches one class a week, but spends 6 hours or more on each lesson, encouraging self-confidence in the children.

Ms. Pat sometimes helps to find needed equipment and keeps a small "bank" at the back of our church where anyone with "lose change" can help the Dysart Community Center.

Dysart Community Center has expanded its services to provide a variety of educational programs for thousands of West Valley residents in our local communities. United Church of Sun City is blessed to be a part of what has become an important link in helping our community members reach their full potential!
