### OPERATION KITTEN RESCUE

Tuesday afternoon at the Templeton Fire & Emergency Services training grounds near the riverbed, training in auto extrication techniques using the Jaws of Life was in progress for five new recruits.

Firefighters had already removed one door of a wrecked car while simulating a rescue when they discovered what appeared to be stuffed animals under the passenger seat. Upon further investigation, the cute little furballs turned out to be two live kittens.

Templeton Firefighters immediately switched gears from training to rescue mode – dubbing the rescue “Operation Kitten”. The kitties were found to be very young, so Firefighter Jonathan Torres wrapped them in his sweater and drove them to Las Tablas Animal Hospital for medical evaluation. Both kittens were given a clean bill of health and put into the care of a local kitten foster parent.

“The kittens have been named Tofu and Stir-fry and are about 2 weeks old,” said Brittany Donecho, Registered Vet Technician and Foster Coordinator for the Homeless Animal Rescue Team (HART). “They will be available for adoption in a couple of months.”

Anyone interested in adopting a kitten is encouraged to contact Donecho at [foster-coordinator@slohart.org](mailto:foster-coordinator@slohart.org). For those interested, new “fur” foster parents are needed as kitten season has been particularly busy this year.

There were no signs of the mother cat and due to the extreme heat of the day, possible predators, and how young the kittens appeared, Firefighters felt that it was in the best interest of the kittens to move them from the remote, empty lot.

### ECHO NEEDS SUMMER VOLUNTEERS

The El Camino Homeless Organization or ECHO, is in immediate need of overnight chaperone volunteers this summer. During the school year, this position is typically filled by Cal Poly students. A minimum of two volunteers are needed each night

to stay at the shelter and help supervise clients in an interactive manner.

This is a unique position compared to other volunteer opportunities as it provides a safe space for volunteers to connect with clients of all ages in a personal way. It also allows volunteers the option of serving with a friend or family member in a quiet, family-like setting.

The shifts run from 5 pm to 7 am. Upon arrival, overnight volunteers will receive training from an experienced orientor, who will provide a tour of the facility and outline expected duties for the evening. Chaperones sleep in shifts, with one volunteer awake at all times. An on-site resident staff member is on-call throughout the duration of the overnight shift.

Volunteer duties include supervising outdoor children's activities like basketball, four-square, etc., acting as a listening ear for clients wanting to talk, and alerting the on-site resident staff member should anything happen throughout the evening. This is a safe and extremely rewarding experience that gives volunteers the opportunity to immediately see the impact their service has on the lives of others.
