# THE FIRST CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH IN WORCESTER Call for a Special Congregational Meeting

April 28, 2020

To: The Members of the First Congregational Church in Worcester

Subject: Call for a Special Meeting, requested by the Church Council to be held on Wednesday, May 6th at 7:00 pm via telephone conference (see NOTE below).

#### **Business:**

- 1. The Church Council requests that the Congregation authorize it to pursue a forgivable loan created by Congress in The Paycheck Protection Program ("PPP") to help small businesses, including churches, to pay their employees during the COVID-19 crisis. The Congregation directs that any funds obtained be used solely to cover payroll costs and that the Church Council will apply for loan forgiveness as soon as the loan is depleted.
- 2. The Congregation authorizes the current Moderator, Matt Ahaesy to sign any necessary loan documents on the Congregation's behalf.

#### **NOTES:**

- 1. Precautions introduced in Massachusetts to combat the spread of Covid-19 prohibit that we hold an in person congregational meeting. Therefore, this meeting will occur as a **phone conference** to be held at 7 pm on Wednesday, May 6th.

- 5. If you have any questions concerning the phone conference process, please call or text Greg Waters at 774-701-2635.
- 6. We will need at least 12 members on this phone call to meet the quorum requirements of our by-laws. Since we cannot 'see' you the Clerk will have to do a roll call to establish who is on the call and also to record votes. This process will be tedious and we request your patience.
- 7. If you need to have background conversation at home, please, please mute your phone or otherwise cover the mouthpiece so others on the call can hear the individual who is addressing the meeting.
