Dan Snowden, co-owner with wife Marsha, says that early on in the pandemic they closed down for nearly two months as they grappled with redefining what they do, and how to do it safely and meet expectations.

Takeout-only since opening back up in the Spring, Louise's Place was busy with extra tourists coming into town, but still missed customers they depend on when the scenic train tours were canceled for the season.

Overall, cafe food orders have stayed pretty steady, says Snowden, however, much of their business has depended on catering outside group events, weddings, parties and funerals. Needless to say, group catering has been a total loss since March.

However, a unique adaptation the Snowdens have implemented has helped. Adding the "Plus Pantry Provisions" to their shop, indoor seating space has been made over to shelves sporting interesting cuisine tidbits. This isn't your typical pantry, but something finer and more cosmopolitan. Think pole-caught bonito tuna from Spain, balsamic vinegar from Italy, and squid-ink pasta.

Originally from the UK (Great Britain) Snowden says his extensive travel throughout Europe has informed his idea of what tastes good.

"We've added some unique, high-quality item to the store from around the world and locally, I've enjoyed that and I think people are kind of liking it," said Snowden.

Louise's menu has also been trimmed down to accommodate takeout presentation, and they have added take-and-bake premade meals for the freezer.

"We've streamlined things for takeout, and focused on the things we do well like home baked bread and pasties to try to ride this out," said Snowden.

Snowden says that strong local support has not gone unnoticed.

"The people of the town are supportive of us, and that feels good, people realize it's been a hard time for us and have done things like buy gift cards and we appreciate that," said Snowden.
