Clergy Column

We celebrated Columbus Day this past week. I celebrated it twice. Christopher Columbus and his crew made landfall in the New World on October 12, 1492, which is officially recognized as Columbus Day. We observed Columbus day this past Monday, which is the general custom, so as to potentially give employees a three-day weekend. I dare say, few workers had the luxury of observing this holiday, and it is getting fewer and fewer each year.
