This craft of cutting paper into intricate designs was introduced by the German culture.

Throughout the year, we have had fun reading. Mrs. Burkman read aloud to us, <u>The Wizard of Oz</u>, and then we watched the movie version to compare and contrast the events. duction was presented to Mrs. Burkman's grandson and granddaughter who were visiting from Hawaii.



After the play, the characters and stage crew were introduced. In the classroom, we watched a Paw Patrol cartoon and Mrs. Burmkan surprised us with cupcakes. We can't wait to receive our certificate at the end of the school year. During Catholic Schools Week, we collected items to give to Mary's Shelter. To celebrate our generosity, we had a baby shower. We made cards for the women at the shelter, played fun games, and even tasted some baby food.

During our time in 4A, we improved by helping others in the world through paying attention to our own behavior. We worked to earn stars on the Super Improvers Wall by following directions, meeting expectations, and completing work to the best of our ability.
