



From the President's Desk

We all know the old saying, "If only these walls could talk...what a tale they would have to share!" I'm sure that is especially true with our Woodward Mansion. Its walls, paneled with imported wood, seem to depict the warmth of a storied home. Children have been born within these walls. Elegant social events and the company of some of San Antonio's most interesting citizens have breathed life and joy into the house from its earliest days. Walls are mostly mute but I'm sure at our **first General Meeting of the year on October 6th**, we will be entertained and enlightened with a family member's talk about life in the early days of our beautiful Mansion. Mr. Tom Bagby, great-grandson of the Mansion's builder, David Woodward, is our October program speaker. More information for the October meeting is on page 3 of this newsletter.

Now what about events that may have occurred just **outside** the Mansion walls? For example, it is an often-repeated story that in 1865, a coil-spring driven "air ship" took flight in San Pedro Park next to where our Club stands today (documents in the DRT Library confirm the basic design and local financing of the machine). The alleged "first" flier was Jacob Brodbeck, a university graduate from Germany who was an inventor and teacher among other talents. After enduring two months of stormy weather on a ship crossing the Atlantic Ocean to America, Brodbeck decided it would be better to fly. He made his way to the Texas Hill Country with the dream to design an "air ship". Here he earned the moral and financial support of local investors including Dr. Ferdinand Herff in San Antonio. Brodbeck's coil-spring driven machine reportedly succeeded in "sailing" over the treetops. However, he could not keep the springs wound up, so the plane would not continue to fly. Whether or not this new Texan beat the Wright Brothers in powered flight, the one thing historians agree on is that Brodbeck's "air ship" crashed upon landing. Oh, by the way, to add to the story of this pioneer in flight – Jacob was my great-great grandfather.

At our annual Fall Luncheon this month we have another opportunity to "step back in time"; this time to enjoy the music of a pioneer of the Grand Ole Opry. Come enjoy a musical program as Patsy Cline "comes alive" through the talents of international recording star Patsy Torres. The show and luncheon will take place **September 15th at the San Antonio Country Club**. We are excited to offer our outstanding boutique and silent auction at the event. We are anticipating a sell-out luncheon so don't wait to get your paid reservations in to Tina Zimmerman at the WCSA office. The reservation deadline is September 8th. See you there!

October is a big month for the Woman's Club of San Antonio. This October we celebrate the 123rd anniversary of the oldest continuous service/social club for women in San Antonio. For ninety-five of those years, we have formed our bonds and served our community from the comfort of the Woodward Mansion. This year, in addition to honoring our eighteen Charter Members, we will have a special program on the early history of the Woodward Mansion and its first family, the David Woodward family. The program will be presented by Mr. Woodward's great-grandson, Tom Bagby. Mr. Bagby is bringing stories of the early years in the Mansion AND an original furnishing of the Mansion which the Bagby family wishes returned to 1717 San Pedro after almost 100 years.

We not only share a home with the Woodward family, we share a history of commitment to the city including Fiesta traditions. In 1905 Mr. Woodward reigned with the first Fiesta royalty as King Selamat. His daughter, Hazel, was Fiesta royalty in 1915. 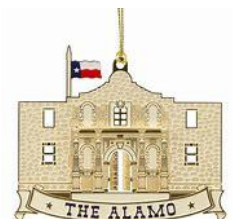

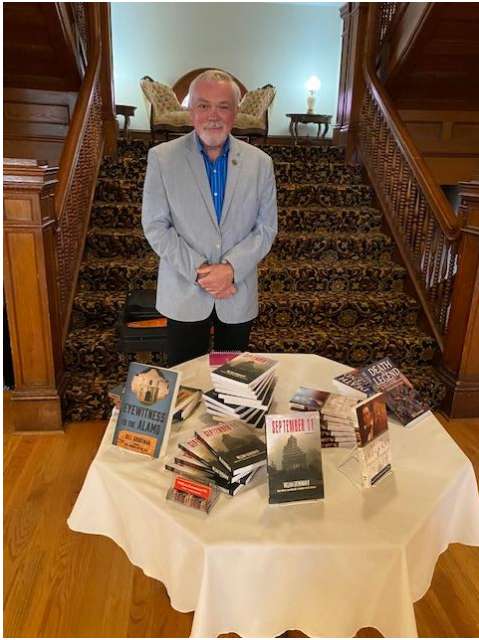

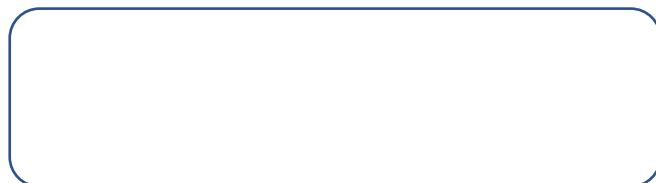
