A. Consider and Discuss Ordinance No. 0-2023-11

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CISCO, TEXAS, AMENDING SECTION 13-24 “DESIGNATION OF STOP INTERSECTIONS” OF THE CITY’S CODE OF ORDINANCES; CHANGING THE TWO WAY STOP AT BEECH AND E. 23RD STREET TO A FOUR WAY STOP, AND DESIGNATING A FOUR-WAY STOP INTERSECTION AT BEECH STREET AND E. 22ND STREET; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. (First Reading)

Mr. Archer explained that the ordinance was presented in regard to traffic control in a busy residential neighborhood.

B. Consider and Discuss Long Range Planning

Mr. Archer updated the Council on ongoing projects including:

- Williamson Dam-Improvements have been made including security fencing, lighting and railings.
- Wastewater Treatment Plant-the Humbletown lift station which is Phase 1 of the project is waiting for the arrival of materials to be completed. Phase 2, the actual plant, will take 18-24 months.
- Hidden Shores Annexation-There will be a meeting of the Hidden Shores Property Owner’s Association held on July 15, 2023 at 2:00 where discussion will take place on the annexation.
- Exit 332-project is stalled based on budgetary constraints-no update.
- Airport-The taxiway has been extended and future plans include updating the intended use plan and creating new leasable spaces.
- Function Junction-Property has been surveyed and grant application is being completed for submission to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.
- TML-The Texas Municipal League will hold its annual conference on October 4-6 in Dallas for any wanting to attend.
