A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ROBERT.....

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Contrary to popular belief Easter is not just a single day event, it is a full season in the liturgical church year. The celebration of Easter lasts for fifty days, beginning with Easter Sunday and ending on Pentecost, which is celebrated on June 9th this year. So in honor of our continued Easter celebration I would like to take this space to expand upon some of the ideas I introduced in my Easter Sunday sermon.

When I was nine years old I awoke in the middle of the night crying uncontrollably because I did not want to die. I wasn't sick and I wasn't in any danger, at least that I knew, of mortal harm but I just had this sudden awareness of my own mortality and that at some point in my life I would die. This realization shook me to my very core and I just laid there and cried. My mother, hearing my sobs, came and comforted me saying, "do not worry for when we die we will all be able to go to heaven and be with Jesus." This comforted me at the time and when we went to church it was constantly backed up by the pastor and my Sunday school teachers who continuously reminded us that "Jesus rose from the dead so that we too could have eternal life in heaven".

This is a comforting idea but unfortunately a few years later I went to a bible camp where our cabin councilor introduced us to the book of Revelation. He used the scary imagery of beasts and dragons littered throughout the narrative to let us know that we were all going to go to hell unless we truly began following Jesus.

Once again that fear gripped me and for the next couple of years I lived in constant fear that God was going to throw me into hell because I wasn't good enough. Finally I broke down and had my own reformation moment and asked, "Why am I so concerned about what comes after death? Isn't what we do now with this life more important?"

I love being a Lutheran because at the central heart of our theology is that Jesus already opened up heaven for ALL OF US! We no longer need to worry about where we are going after death as that question has already been answered—our responsibility is to live in thanksgiving for what Jesus has already done for us.

Life is not about loving God, helping those in need, and caring for God's creation so that we can earn a spot in heaven. Life is about loving God, helping those in need and caring for God's creation because we are giving thanks for what God has already done for us. Since we do not have to live with that anxiety floating over our heads we are free to express our love without fear of God's judgement.

What if we don't live a life of thanksgiving toward God? What if we continue to stumble and fall by doing things we know aren't right?

Each Gospel narrative is a little different from the others. Events are changed, left out, or presented in different orders, yet in each Gospel Jesus' betrayal, trial, death and resurrection are given center stage. Some of the details are changed in each narrative but each one spends several chapters detailing the importance of this event. This part of the Gospel is known as the Passion and within this narrative we see Jesus betrayed, abandoned, mocked, tortured and finally put to death in an extremely horrific and painful way, yet despite all that he forgives us.

This means that no matter how deep a hole we find ourselves in and no matter how many times we keep falling in that hole we always will have a place at the table. Amen.
