Psalm 37:1-11

Do not fret because of those who are evil or be envious of those who do wrong; for like the grass they will soon wither, like green plants they will soon die away. Trust in the Lord and do good; dwell in the land and enjoy safe pasture. Take delight in the Lord, and he will give you the desires of your heart. Commit your way to the Lord; trust in him and he will do this: He will make your righteous reward shine like the dawn, your vindication like the noonday sun. Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for him; do not fret when people succeed in their ways, when they carry out their wicked schemes. Refrain from anger and turn from wrath; do not fret-it leads only to evil. For those who are evil will be destroyed, but those who hope in the Lord will inherit the land. A little while, and the wicked will be no more; though you look for them, they will not be found. But the meek will inherit the land and enjoy peace and prosperity. Psalm 37:1-11

The Psalms are amazing for the way they capture the vast array of human emotion toward God. They range from accusations of abandonment and gut wrenching desolation to incredibly hopeful expressions like the passage above. It doesn't matter where you are in your walk with God, there is likely a Psalm that will resonate with you.

The verses above paint a picture of God's provision for the faithful and God's impending judgment upon the wicked. The psalmist invites us to trust fully in an order to the universe that preserves those who trust in God and eliminates the wicked. Many of us will read this and find its perspective a bit too "rosey." We wonder when it is that we will be vindicated? When it is that those we see profiting from injustice and dishonesty will be stopped? We may be tempted to toss this Psalm out as impractical and far removed from our reality.

However, the beauty of the Psalms is not only that they can reflect our experience, but also that they can call us beyond our current state. While this Psalm may appear more lofty than realistic, our Christian hope reminds us to look not only at what is now or even in the near future, but also at God's intended future for the world. It is this type of hope, resurrection hope, that is distinctly Christian and allows us to be buoyed by a Psalm like this, even in the roughest of waters.


