Presents: Development and Attachment Considerations for the Child Play Therapist in High-Conflict Divorce/Paternity Cases



This interactive workshop will explore the ways a child's specific developmental stage typically affects his/her reactions to high conflict separated or divorcing parents. Erik Erikson's first two developmental stages will be reviewed and illustrated with specific case examples. Participants will be invited to identify what they need to know about the child, the parents, and the situation, then share their expertise in how to intervene as the treating therapist to the child and parents. The presenter will share tips to crafting parenting plans that are developmentally appropriate for the child. The workshop will include a number of handouts that the presenter has developed over many years of working with high-conflict families. This workshop offers 2.5 CEUs.

I started my professional career as a child welfare worker. It was while working in the system when I realized I could be more helpful to these children as a therapist than I ever could as a case manage, so even before I started my master's program, I knew I was going to specialize in treating children. Like so many mental health counseling programs, there were minimal courses about working with children in my master's program. I graduated with my MA in mental health counseling having had a course in Human Development, but nothing even remotely close to theory or practice in working with children.

After I started working with children it didn't take very long to find out the skills you learn for how to treat adults don't go very in treating children. Like so many of my colleagues at the time who had no specific training in how to counsel children, I resorted to using books like <u>101 Favorite Play Therapy</u> <u>Techniques</u>, and <u>101 More Favorite Play Therapy Techniques</u>. I saw the kids were responding to these techniques, but I knew that in order to be truly effective at treating these children I needed to learn the theory behind the techniques. I needed to become a trained play therapist.

It was about that time that my husband was transferred to Hawaii for what was supposed to be just a two year assignment (It is now an indefinite assignment). My plan when we moved here was to be a stay at home mom and enjoy my two year Hawaiian vacation with my then three year old daughter. After a few months of being a stay at home mom I started to realize that I missed working. My husband deserves the credit for doing the research and finding Carla Sharp's year-long play therapy training. I guess he actually deserves a little credit for really listening to me when I was complaining about being bored too!

I enrolled in Carla's class in the fall of 2013. I knew from the very first class I attended that this was what I had been missing, this is exactly what I had been looking for; a theoretical foundation for effectively treating children. And not just treating children's behaviors, actually helping these children to HEAL. It was eye opening and inspiring. I decided at my very first class that I was definitely going to continue on with the requirements to become a registered play therapist. I finished the class in 2014, and finished the required supervision hours in 2015. I officially became an RPT in the Spring of this year. I opened a practice in Wahiawa, Oahu Play Therapy, and I'm doing what I love, every day, I'm helping children heal through play.
