











This is a class of improving your physical ability, and in developing your sportsmanship. Possibly even working yourself, toward an athletic Scholarship.












Social Studies is the only kind of class that will help you understand what is going on in the world. It will help you predict what may happen in the future, too.








Every student should master basic mathematics for use in purchasing, selling, investing, banking, check writing, making change, planning expenses, budgeting, taking care of taxes, etc.
