# RESIDENT **Spotlight**

was born April 24, 1926, on the family farm at Dieterich, Illinois, I was the first born to Aloysius H. Westendorf and Rose E. Hartman Westendorf. My father was a farmer. To earn extra money he would travel to the Champaign, Illinois area to be a corn picker. That was before they picked corn with a

corn picking machine. My mother was a school teacher at Pesotum. Illinois.

I had one sister, Mildred. She died of polio when she was five. I had three brothers Francis, John and Raymond who are deceased. I have one brother, Leroy living in Dieterich, Illinois. I graduated high school at Dieterich in 1943. It was just a three year high school. To go the fourth year of high school I would have to have gone to Effingham. My father decided that I was needed at home to take care of the house.

In the summer time we would get together with the neighbor kids to play baseball. I couldn't run very fast so they would have me pitch. I liked to pitch and was pretty good at it! I like to watch the Cardinals on TV, and I enjoyed going to St. Louis to the Car-

My mother died when I was nine years old. Then my Aunt Rose came to stay with us. My mother and Aunt Rose helped

me learn to cook, bake, and embroidery. Then Rose died when I was fourteen, so I had to take over keeping the house.

I met my husband, Harold H. Ulhorn, at a wedding dance in Dieterich when I was 20 years old. We got married on November 28, 1946, which was Thanksgiving that

year. On our wedding day we had pictures taken right after the ceremony. But in the middle of the afternoon the photographer came back to say the pictures didn't take. So we had to redo the pictures. This was after several of the wedding party had been enjoying the alcoholic beverages at the wedding. It was hard to redo some of the pictures!

Harold was a mechanic until he lost his right eye in an accident at work. Then we rented a farm at Teu-

topolis, Illinois. In 1957 we bought a farm at Shumway, Illinois. We farmed there until 1969 when Harold bought a farm at Excello, Missouri.

We had seven children. I had a son die in a hospital fire when he was 5 months old. My living children are Rosemary, Jane, Bernie, and Dale Ulhorn, Carol Ulhorn White, and John Ulhorn. I have seven grandchildren and eleven great grandchildren so far.

In August of 1984, our family had a terrible tragedy. My husband, Harold, and my brother, John, both drowned while fishing at the pits at Thomas Hill Lake. I had to learn how to survive and take care of myself and my son, John. He was still in high school at the time.

I liked to embroidery. I made a lot of quilts and pillow cases

for my children and grandchildren and great randchildren. I have some I need to finish.

I worked for Loch Haven as a house keeper for 7 years starting in the late 70's. After I quit working, I volunteered here at Loch Haven helping the residents to play bingo.

My daughter, Carol White, has worked as an LPN at Loch Haven for over 30 years. So when I started needing help, I came to Loch Haven. I like to play bingo and dominos, and I enjoy going to the music activities.



# Cooking thru the Ages!

### **Orange Pecan French Toast**

1 cup packed brown sugar 1/3 cup butter, melted

2 tablespoons light corn syrup

1/3 cup chopped pecans

12 (3/4 inch thick) slices French bread

1 teaspoon grated orange zest

1 cup fresh orange juice

1/2 cup 2% milk

3 tablespoons white sugar

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

3 egg whites

2 eggs

Stir together brown sugar, melted butter, and corn syrup. Pour into a greased 9x13 inch baking dish. Spread evenly. Sprinkle pecans over the top. Arrange the bread slices in the bottom of the dish so they are in a snug single layer. Whisk together orange zest, orange juice, milk, sugar, cinnamon, vanilla, egg whites, and eggs. Pour this over the bread, pressing on the bread slices to help absorb the liquid. Refrigerate for at least

one hour, or overnight. Preheat oven to 350°. Bring to room temperature (20 minutes). Bake 35 minutes. Invert each piece as you serve.



1 pound sausage

1 Tsp oregano or rosemary 1/2 tsp salt 1/4 tsp pepper

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Place a skillet over medium heat and add the sausage. Break up the sausage as it cooks, letting it brown completely. Unroll the crescent rolls and spread them out in the bottom of a 9×13 pan, pressing the seams together to make one large sheet of dough. Spread the sausage over the

dough. Sprinkle the cheese on top of the sausage. In a medium bowl, whisk the eggs with the milk, oregano or rosemary, salt, and pepper. Pour the egg mixture over the top of the casserole. Bake at 400 degrees for 15-20 minutes until the crust is golden and the eggs are set.


