Divide and conquer! We have heard that so many times. It is a dirty strategy. We have seen and/or experienced it in action. Politicians use it pretty much any time they can; and it works, all the time. It worked -DIPPASION almost worked – in our second reading today. but for the timely intervention of St. Paul. Like the parable of the sower, St. Paul labored among the Corinthians and sowed the precious seed of faith. Following in his

footsteps Apollos and others strengthened their blossoming faith. That's when the eternal enemy struck and sowed weeds of discord, rivalry and disunity. Brothers and sisters that spoke with one mind and focused on one purpose suddenly began to differentiate between those that belonged to Paul or Apollos or Peter or Christ!

First, Paul praises them for their gifts and good works before tackling the monster of division head-on. As a solution, he points them back to the original message and focus: Christ Crucified.

From our churches to our homes, from our classrooms to our playgrounds, from the White House to our city halls, from Wall Street to our shopping plazas, the Lord has planned marvelous things for us. We want to achieve marvelous things. But our eternal enemy also yearns to achieve dreadful things. So, the devil plants that seed of rivalry and division among us. Worse yet, is that he plants it, like a bomb, in a place that it will do the most harm: our families. Thus, we have those famous two words: sibling rivalry! It starts that early!

Constantly being aware of the devil's plot helps us to keep it in sight. It helps us to combat it consciously and with determination. It helps us to pray about it and ask the Lord to help us overcome the devil's antics. It helps us to then engage in activities and thoughts that will help to dismantle whatever builds walls and separates us who are supposed to be one family in the Lord.

Like St. Paul, may we always have the courage to tackle division and rivalry wherever and whenever it raises its ugly head. May we do so with compassion, and with patience. Amen.

# ASSOCIATE MISSIONARIES OF ST. PAUL (AMSP) PARTNERSHIP IN MISSION



Early missionaries arrived in Nigeria in the 1800s to sow the seed of faith. Since then this seed has sprouted and grown into a plentiful harvest, the Missionary Society of St. Paul. We are privileged to be missionaries from Nigeria sharing the faith with our brothers and sisters around the world. We are particularly thankful for the 25 years of ministry in the United States of America.

We also have the Associates in St. Benedict the Moor (Savannah, GA diocese); Sacred Heart/St. Mary Parish, Port Arthur (Beaumont, TX Diocese), St. Catherine of Siena in Donaldsonville, LA, and St. Benedict the Moor in Napoleonville, LA (both in Baton Rouge diocese). These associates pray for our priests and our missions. They make financial contributions to support our work in the missions and to sponsor our seminarians preparing for the missionary priesthood. Some of them have even gone on mission trips to Nigeria and will be making trips in the near future to other places where the Missionary Society of St. Paul priests are working.

This weekend, 15 dedicated men and women from Saint Bartholomew's Parish will join the growing number of the AMSP. We thank them for their decision to promote the work of the missions of the Church through their support to the MSP priests. May God bless them as they embark on this new journey.
