WHAT IS COMPOSTING AND WHY DO IT?



Composting is a controlled natural decomposition of organic material, such as leaves, grass clippings, prunings, and fruit and vegetable scraps.



Composting saves money by reducing the need to purchase commercial fertilizers and soil amendments.



Composting benefits your yard and garden by improving soil health and fertility. It also helps the environment by recycling organic material and extending the life of landfills.

COMPOSTING BASICS

- There are four basic ingredients required for composting GREENS (50%), BROWNS (50%), WATER, and AIR. Mixing the proper amounts of each ingredient is crucial.
- GREENS include grass clippings, green leaves, fresh prunings, and fruits and vegetable scraps. Be sure not to add any meat or dairy to pile.
- BROWNS consist of dry, woody material such as dead leaves, wood chips, twigs, sawdust, and paper. These materials are best when shredded or chopped to prevent bulky pile.
- WATER—keep pile moist.
- AIR is essential to a sweet smelling composting pile. Turn your pile once or twice a week.



USING FINISHED COMPOST



Top dress your planters by spreading compost to a depth of 3 inches around the base of plants and shrubs, much like you'd spread mulch.



For lawns, screen compost over the surface of lawn to a depth of 1/2 inch.
