- **2-28-22.** Well for my first blog of 2022 I picked a tumultuous moment in history. Currently, I am working on upgrading the Swedish Army to current standards, with a more comprehensive TO&E. - 8-15-22. Massive update. I have added the U.S. XVIII Airborne Corps to the Advanced Assault US Army page. I have chosen to model the Corps based on the Force XXI concept that was being developed in the late 90s. I have also chosen to place the 48th Infantry Brigade (M) GaARNG with the 24th ID (M) instead of replacing it all with the 3rd ID. The 48th is modeled after the AOE concept to give contrast to the Force XXI units. In all probability conversion to Force XXI probably would have taken place alongside the rest of the Division.
