

Town Manager's Report
Tuesday- September 24, 2013

Kansas Road Reconstruction work- According to Jim Kidder of our Public Works Dept., our contractor has begun the milling and grinding work on the lower 1.7 miles and will continue to work until the base is ready to receive the pavement. Though one lane will remain open traffic will be slower through this construction period and we suggest using alternative routes.

Sewer Construction- The work being done on Main Street will continue for the next two weeks. We have discovered several sections requiring additional work and will continue until the Week of the Fryeburg Fair. During that period we will move to the side streets.

United Way- We have received pledge and donation information from the United Way Campaign and will provide our employees with that information for their decision as to what they may want to do.

Rt. 302 MDOT Public Hearing: The final public hearing for this important reconstruction project will take place on Wed. Sept. 25th at the Leura Hill Eastman Performing Arts Center at Fryeburg Academy from 6-8 PM. The section of road being worked on will be from the Saco River in Fryeburg easterly for about 5 miles to Stack Em Inn Road in Bridgton. The \$6.3 million dollar project is due to start in the summer of 2014.

Committee Volunteers Needed: The Town of Bridgton continues to seek volunteers to work on various committees which advise the Select Board. Currently, we seek those individuals who want to work on recycling efforts in Town. This committee meets once a month and is charged with education and encouraging the public to recycle more to reduce our total disposal costs.
