As we walk through the cold and snowy days of winter, I was blessed recently to spend a weekend at Kalahari with my wife and daughter. My daughter is at a wonderful age where she doesn't seem to have any fear. She wants to do everything herself. Already I've heard the immortal words "Daddy, I don't need you" that has shaken the spirit of many parents throughout the years. Kalahari was no different. Skylie took her little 3-foot-tall body and with all the courage she could muster walked bravely into the wave pool. I watched as the water grew to one-foot waves pushing back on her legs and buckling her knees. She pressed on. Two-foot waves can next, smacking her chest and pushing her

backwards. Finally, the three-foot waves came in, knocking her chest and pushing her backwards. Finally, the three-foot waves came in, knocking her down and flooding her face with water. Of course, she boldly stood up and said "Again!" Strangely, this made me think about how we study the Bible. For many of us, we've never gotten past the surface of our Scriptural understanding. We get our toes wet. Maybe we let a few key verses buckle our knees a little or challenge our foundation. But, how often do we feel ready to go really deep? To look at the Bible in a way that might get us in over our heads, maybe even move the foundations of our faith until we find ourselves knocked back and starting again from the beginning.

Most people don't test their faith in this way, but in February I'd like us to give that a try. We're going to be reading the Book of Ephesians, and rather just read the book on it's surface so that we can take away a couple memory verses to hang on our refrigerator, I want us to look at Ephesians in a way that makes us

move, change, question, and strengthen the things we believe. To do that, we'll look at three different levels at which we can examine Scripture. Whether you'll be joining us in February or not, I hope you'll consider looking at these three areas when you study Scripture at home.

**Historical:** Ask yourself, what is this piece of Scripture? Who wrote it? Who were they writing to? When did they write it? What was the environment like at the time? How were people dealing with political issues, social issues, family issues, and so on.

**Doctrinal:** This is a fancy church way of asking what the Scripture is trying to say. Our Doctrine is our agreed upon beliefs. When we read Scripture we often must ask what definitive statements are being made about the nature of God, the nature of people, or our relationship with Jesus. There's a key verse in Ephesians 2:10 "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, **which God prepared in advance for us to do**." "God prepared in advance for us to do", is that just a clever phrase by the author or does it speak to some deeper understanding of how God created us and interacts with us? That's a question of Doctrine.

**Ethical:** Another way to phrase this would be the application. We can read a piece of Scripture and understand who was writing it, why they wrote, and what truths God had revealed to them in the text...but for the reader the next part is the most challenging. What do we do with it? Why does it matter? How do the teachings of a 2000-year-old text influence my life today and help me better live in Christ? These are the ethical questions of a Scriptural study. How does this piece of Scripture impact the way I live a life that is pleasing to God?

These are the questions we'll unpack as we take a deeper dive in Scripture this February! Please join us!

# Trinity Reminders and Answers to How Do I... and What's That For...Questions

#### **Guidelines for Weather Cancellations at Trinity**

Ottawa County Level 1:

Worship and church activities will be held as usual - please use common sense and precaution when traveling.

Ottawa County Level 2:

All non-worship activities before and after worship are cancelled - this means no Sunday School/Branching Out, church dinners or meeting that may be scheduled, etc. The worship service will be held for those who choose to attend and feel they can travel safely. Please use common sense and precaution when traveling.

Ottawa County Level 3:

No worship service or church-related activities

#### **Use of the Church Hall or Basement**

The church calendar of events is hanging on the wall outside the main office door. You can also view scheduled events on the church website calendar (www.trinityelliston.org). If you would like to reserve the hall or basement take a form from the pouch under the calendar outside the main office, complete it and return it to the office to be scheduled. You are now required to fill out a form for any event that you would like to have in the church (including any rollover events from year to year for holiday parties). Please do not just write on the calendar - we ask you complete the form first. Once the form is reviewed we will add it to the calendar. If you have any questions, please contact Mary.

Please remember to turn the heat down to 58 (or turn it off) after you are finished in the rooms and close the door. We ask everyone to help with this cost saving measure. Thank you!

#### **Table & Chair Sign Out**

Sign-out sheet for tables and chairs is located in the closet across from the main office (on the back of the door). Contact the office to make sure you are on the list for the date you would like to use the tables and chairs. The only tables that are to leave the property are the older wooden style tables. The only chairs that are to leave the property are the wooden chairs. Both tables and chairs that may be taken out are located in the shed by the kitchen entry.
