Regular meeting call to order:

Chairman-Road master Raymond Guzic, Jr, Vice-Chairman Jaime Hartline, Supervisor Scott Guzic, Solicitor Thomas Swope and Secretary Pamela Flis.

Engineer Richard Wray was absent from the meeting due to previous commitments.

Justin Eger, Leslie Devett, Robert and Tamara Crum, David Myers and Jaime and Paul Williams also attended the meeting.

Salute to the Flag:

Public Participation:

- Chairman informed David Myers of a tree that was down on his property and the Roadmaster had pushed it closer to a ditch to clear the roadway. Property owner will use the tree for firewood.
- Paul Williams expressed his displeasure of the winter maintenance on State Route 2015; no other township resident has complaints of the road maintenance. Mr. Williams claims a petition is needed to return the maintenance back to PennDot. Washington Township has opened Farmers Turnpike many a morning before Penn Dot plow arrives.
 1. Areas of the township received more anti-skid than others, if there is a grade to the road, a slope or stop sign. Temperatures must rise before the salt will take effect of melting ice.
 2. Feedback from residents of Farmers Turnpike, they are satisfied with winter maintenance on the state road, there are approximately 1,000 residents of Washington Township, with only one complaint, Supervisor Hartline feels that Washington Township has a high success rate.
 3. Part of the reason Farmers Turnpike was taken care of so well; is due to the fact that Washington Township would plow the road to access rural roads, within the township. Mr. Williams's view of how Farmers Turnpike was maintained is due to the fact Washington Township was working with PennDot, plowing the road constantly.
- Mr. Williams is not complaining about the plowing but the lack of anti-skid and salt. The more traffic there is the more the salt and anti-skid is moved on the road surface, Farmers Turnpike is plagued by drifting snow in three prime areas and is

- not heavily traveled, as compared to a borough or Route 53.
- The day Mr. Williams contacted PennDot to complaint of Farmers Turnpike; PennDot had inspected the road and found winter maintenance satisfactory.
- Farmers Turnpike is plowed before Scanlon Hill or Lilly Level Road which is maintained by PennDOT. The State of PA has cut back on winter maintenance on secondary roads. The Washington Township Supervisors are concerned about public safety and treat all roads in the township the same, and go beyond their scope of duties for snow removal, salt and anti-skid placement.

Solicitors Report:

As Discussed:

- 105 Orange Lane-Delinquent Sanitation- Municipal Lien filed with Cambria County.
- Property is currently unoccupied; to avoid the accumulation of additional expenses against the property, the property should be exonerated, and having the knowledge the property is not generating garbage. Signed exoneration form from property owner is not required in this specific situation; Washington Township could be criticized for sending a bill to uninhabited property.

- Robert Crum inquired about the recent activity of a large crane at the turbine farm; this crane may be for turbine blade maintenance/ inspection. Increased traffic along Mountain Road, Roadmaster to contact Duke Energy for clarification and to remind of the 10 ton weight limit along Mountain Road and procure a road bond if applicable.

Regional Recreation Center:

- DEP to get the mining permit released at the center, so that Cambria County may move forward to secure grant funding.
- Supervisor Jaime Hartline is working closely with John Dubnansky, Cambria County grant facilitator; Washington Township should soon be in receipt of a letter of correspondence from Department of Environmental Protection giving Washington Township permission to move forward with grant funding, without the release of the mining permit.

- Roadmaster removed snow fencing at the Regional Recreation Center, fencing causing snow drifts on the roadways.
