Mapping of Surface Water Hydrography and Drainage Explored in Workshop

The California Water and Environmental Modeling Forum, in coordination with USGS, offering and all-day, hands-on technical workshop on October 20, 2015 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at West Yost office located at 2020 Research Park Drive, Suite 100, in Davis. New Funding Available for Urban Runoff Projects

The U.S. EPA is offering approximately \$1.6 million in funding through their Urban Water Small Grants program for projects that address urban runoff pollution while producing multiple community benefits. Each award is expected to range between \$40,000 and \$60,000. The <u>deadline to submit proposals</u> is Friday, November 20, 2015.

Delta Independent Science Board to Meet in Contra Costa

Knightsen and Oakley will welcome members of the Delta Independent Science Board (ISB) October 14-16th, providing an opportunity for local residents to hear about Delta science activities and attend tours of local projects.

The three day event will start Wednesday evening at the Diablo Valley Farm Center with presentations on Delta Narratives and Delta Protection Commission activities. The following morning will include presentations on emergency drought barrier modeling and potential impacts of levee failures on water quality, with an afternoon tour of the Iron House Sanitation District and West False Barrier removal on Jersey Island.

The final morning will include discussions on Delta as an Evolving Place, Delta levees, water quality, and fish reliance on flows, with an afternoon tour of the Dutch Slough Tidal Marsh Restoration Project.

Delta Levees from a 41,000 Foot Perspective

Sustainable Groundwater Management Agencies and Plans Coming Soon

DWR and the SWRCB have <u>scheduled meetings in the Central Valley</u> to provide information on a new state law requiring sustainable groundwater management throughout California. Technical sessions in the afternoons, 1:00-4:00 p.m., are designed to brief local public agencies and organizations about their requirements to form a Groundwater Sustainability Agency by June 30, 2017, and then develop a Groundwater Sustainability Plan by 2020 or 2022 (depending on if a high- or medium-priority groundwater basin). Evening forums, 6:00-8:00 p.m., provide an opportunity for the general public and groundwater users to learn about how they will be impacted.
