DESCRIPTION: The H-52 was the most popular of Pearson's H Series of bows introduced in 1969. Great looking and performing recurve. Beautiful Zebra-wood riser with black and white overlays on the back of the riser. This bow has been reconditioned. In refinishing the limbs, the original decal was well worn, so the current one is a reproduction., Bow has no delamination; no cracks; limbs are straight. Beveled arrow shelf. Overlays and tips are in good condition. No drilled holes; No chips, dings or cracks. No stress lines; the back limbs have some minor crazing (thin horizontal alligator cracks in the exterior varnish). A few minor scratches and nicks here and there. Overall, this is a really nice bow in excellent condition for its age. This bow was put to a stress test (held at full draw for 16 hours to make sure the old glues still held and no stress cracks developed. Comes with a rug rest and side plate as shown, and a new string.
